RICE

Training programs conducted under the National Rice Program focus on balanced fertilization strategy, hybrid rice production, pest management, waste utilization, value-adding, digital technologies, financial literacy, and resource person development. Thus, in 2023, ATI-RTC X was able to conduct 34 training programs and other AF activities for the National Rice Program, involving 3,298 participants. The trainings were designed to improve the abilities of agricultural practitioners, including Agricultural and Biosystems Engineers, Local Farmer Technicians, AEWs, and farmer-leaders.

Moreover, the integration of digital technologies optimizes resource use, contributing to the modernization of the rice sector in the Philippines, promoting food security, and enhancing economic stability for farmers.





LIVESTOCK

ATI-RTC X dedicated 14 trainings under the National Livestock Program and were able to train 315 participants from the various stakeholders of the livestock sector in the region. The training programs conducted include diversified livestock options, artificial insemination, animal health, feed milling, waste management, emergency response, and meat processing.

These capability-builiding activities promoted innovation and best practices to improve product quality, biosecurity measures, overall industry competitiveness, and ensure a more efficient and disease-resistant livestock program in the Philippines.



Trainings Against ASF

African Swine Fever severely impacts livestock production in the Philippines, causing economic losses, reduced pork supply, and livelihood challenges. To prevent or control this outbreak, the Center conducted capability-building programs for Barangay Biosecurity Officers (BBOs).

BABay ASF: Training on Specimen Collection for Barangay Biosecurity Officers (2 Batches - 48 participants in total) were conducted.



CAPABILITY DEVELOPMENT

CORN

ATI-RTC X has conducted a total of eight training programs in 2023 designed to enhance the collaboration, productivity, and market engagement of corn farmers in the region.



Site-specific nutrient management (SSNM) was another significant training program conducted by the Center, which aimed to optimize fertilization for cassava and corn while reducing costs and environmental impact. The program also introduced a computer-based decision support tool called Nutrient Expert, which provides instant nutrient recommendations to farmers for their corn crop.

Farmer Scientist Training Program

ATI-RTC X conducted two batches of Farmer Scientist Training Program. The training participants were taught the necessary technology for corn farming from soil preparation, fertilizer application, proper planting and harvesting, and also farm record keeping. They were also trained in the effective marketing of agricultural products, communication and presentation skills for farmer scientists, and leadership management.



HVCDP

Evolving agricultural practices, technology, and market demands require continuing education for farmers and stakeholders.

Capability-building initiatives conducted under HVCDP focused on enhancing trainers' expertise in nursery establishment, Good Agricultural Practices (GAP), and Integrated Pest Management (IPM) for high-value crops.

ATI-RTC X also conducted specialized trainings such as hydroponics, vegetable production, rubber cultivation, food safety, packaging, and edible landscaping, promoting innovative techniques and quality maintenance. These trainings were aimed at diversifying and sustaining high-value crop production in the region, being one of the biggest producers of vegetables in the country, as well as economically uplifting the lives of its farmers .





ORGANIC AGRICULTURE

The Organic Agriculture Program accomplished 100% of its target for training and other extension-related activities for 2023. These activities include the Training of Trainers on Participatory Guarantee Systems (PGS) Group Expansion, wherein in Mindanao, only Region 10 has two PGS Group accredited by the Bureau of Agriculture and Fisheries Standards (BAFS).



Other extension initiatives such as the Kabataang OA and the Youth Scholarship Grant on Organic Farming to urge more youth to engage in farming and the yearly gathering of the National Organic Agriculture Congress (NOAC) were part of the efforts.

HALAL

Recently, the halal industry in the Philippines has been experiencing substantial growth. Due to its considerable Muslim population, especially in its southern region, and the rising demand for halal products. In the agriculture industry, adhering to halal practices guarantees that agricultural products meet Islamic dietary laws. This not only caters to the needs of Muslim consumers but also creates new market opportunities and promotes ethical farming practices on a global scale.

ATI-RTC X conducted a training program on Halal Production participated by 29 farmer-leaders in the region. The program was to equip farmers with the necessary knowledge and skills on halal production standards and promote sustainable and ethical agricultural practices in line with the industry's standards. Advocacy activities on halal, such as information caravans, were also conducted to further support the promotion of halal practices.

NATIONAL URBAN AND PERI-URBAN AGRICULTURE PROGRAM (NUPAP)

With the main goal of promoting gardening and ensuring consistent food accessibility for urban communities, the Partnership and Accreditation Section (PAS) of the ATI10 initiated a series of Go Urban Gardening: Making FOOD Available (GUGMA) Program in key cities of Northern Mindanao.

Targetted areas for the GUGMA Program were in Iligan City, Cagayan de Oro City, Malaybalay City, El Salvador City, and Gingoog City. GUGMA's mission was met with enthusiasm and strong support from local agriculturists, focal persons, and public officials. Their commitment underscored the growing importance of urban and periurban agriculture in addressing food security challenges.



One of the program's most impactful components was the Seminars on Capability Building through ATI Blended/e-learning that was provided to the 750 aspiring gardeners. This training covered essential techniques for successful gardening in an urban environment and the art of making fermented plant juices to enhance crop yields. Armed with such essential knowledge, these urban gardeners were better equipped to contribute to food secuity for their family and on their community.

ATI-RTC X also installed five (5) nursery houses to selected Learning Site for Agriculture Partners and Local Government Units (LGUs) in the region. The nursery house's beneficiaries are expected to utilize the project by growing different kinds of vegetable seedlings that will be given to their community and walk-in clients.



RICE COMPETITIVENESS ENHANCEMENT FUND

Rice Extension Services Program

In its 5th year of implementation, the Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund continually gears towards improving the competitiveness of rice farmers and achieving an increase in their income. ATI-RTC X has regularly provided our AEWs, farmers, and farmer leaders with training programs and information materials relating to the production of high-quality inbred rice seeds production, rice mechanization, up-skilling farmers on agricultural digitalization and drone technology, as well as agripreneurship.

On its second year of implementation, ATI-RTC X conducted various initiatives under CFIDP playing crucial roles in increasing production, promoting sustainability and fostering innovation within the coconut industry in the region.

REGULAR PROGRAM

Social Technology Trainings

Capability-building activities on social technologies were crafted to capacitate the Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs) through the ATI-RTC X priority programs focusing on extension and communication skills. They were trained to become effective leaders and extension managers by being adaptable to changes, adopting innovations, and having efficient leadership and management skills.

The trainings conducted were as follows:

- 4 Batches of Training on Extension Delivery System
- 2 Batches of Training on Extension Management for Extension Managers
- 2 Batches of Resource Person Development Course
- Skilling Up: A Training on Extension Delivery System
 Technology Updates for Corn Trainers
- Scaling Up the Industry of Manila Hemp: Production Technology of Abaca (This enhancement training was conducted to test the newly developed module on abaca production in collaboration with the provincial/municipal/city LGUs, other government agencies such as DA-RFO 10, and State Universities and Colleges (SUCs).







Digital Literacy Trainings



Digital literacy is essential in today's increasingly technology-driven world. To keep up with technological trends, ATI-RTC X hold trainings to enhance the knowledge of every stakeholder in the agriculture sector. These agri-technologies involve smartphone usage, internet safety, agri applications, social media marketing, digital transactions, and smart agriculture technologies. There were 14 out of the 137 trainings activities in 2023 involved in digital literacy.

Agricultural training programs can be more inclusive, empowering, and beneficial for women, youth, differently-abled individuals, and senior citizens. Recognizing diverse contributions to nation-building, the Center initiated conducts lectures and training programs focused on sustainable agriculture and livelihood improvement, emphasizing inclusivity, empowerment, and environmentally responsible practices for long-term socio-economic

Gender and Development (GAD)

Training programs in support to gender and development includes backyard gardening, capability enhancement for women, coconut products and by- products, agripreneurship, and waste utilization for rice. These initiatives demonstrate a commitment to empowering women, promoting gender equality, and fostering sustainable agricultural practices for broader community development.

To mark the National Women's Month, ATI-RTC X held a Capability Enhancement Training for Women in El Salvador City from March 22-24, 2023. Collaborating with the City Social Welfare and Development Office, the training was attended by 25 Women's Association members. It covered key topics such as gender equality, the Safe Spaces Act, Solo Parent Act, Violence Against Women and their Children Law, and the Magna Carta for Women.

Senior Citizen

Specialized trainings tailored for senior citizens aligned with the goals of encouraging them to stay active, learn new skills, and engage in meaningful activities. Training programs conducted contributes directly to the physical, mental, and social well-being of seniors, providing structured opportunities for them to participate in activities that enhance their quality of life.

In 2023, 25 senior citizens participated in the urban container household gardening training, while 26 joined the urban gardening with straw mushroom production program. These initiatives were designed to meet their specific needs, encourage health, sustainability, and empowerment through practical skills, community engagement, and a holistic approach to healthy living.

Differently-Abled Person

The Training on Urban Container Household Gardening engaged 25 differently-abled individuals in Cagayan de Oro City (August 8-11, 2023) and 26 in El Salvador City (October 11-13, 2023). The training program aims to enhance the knowledge and skills of differently-abled persons in vegetable gardening for livelihood, fostering productivity and self-sufficiency on their barangays. Additionally, the training seeks to ensure the sustainable production of healthy vegetables within their reach, meeting food needs at home.

Persons Deprived with Liberty

ATI-RTC X conducted a "Training on Backyard Gardening" at the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology Region X in El Salvador City, Misamis Oriental, on May 30-31, 2023. With 26 participants, the program aimed to enhance their knowledge and skills in backyard gardening, covering crucial topics such as vegetable gardening basics, soil importance, composting techniques, and production technology for specific crops.

The training program also supported the persons deprived with liberty (PDL) on their rehabilitation, as well as potentially reducing recidivism rates.













Enterprise Development

Empowering aspiring agri-preneurs to equip them with comprehensive skills for successful agri-enterprises through Kapatid Agri Mentor Me Program (KAMMP), Digital Marketing, and other related training were conducted.

Kapatid Agri Mentor Me Program

In collaboration with PCE - Go Negosyo, an online training was conducted through the Zoom platform on May 10 to June 1, 2023, involving 25 participants hailing from various provinces within the region. The initiative included lectures, discussions, workshops and mentoring and coaching aimed at refining and advancing the participants' business plans and presentation of individual business plans.

Digital Marketing

Empowering farmers and young farmers with digital marketing skills, Training on Virtual Store: Digital Marketing for Young Farmers in Support to Out-of-School Youth Development Alliance (OSYDA) and two batches of Capacity Enhancement Training on Digital Marketing were conducted. The program seeks to broaden their market reach, strengthen their online presence, and contribute to their economic development.

Farm Business School

Active engagement in training is important for an effective sharing of knowledge and skills. ATI-RTC X organized two 10-day Training of Trainers sessions on Farm Business Schools in El Salvador City. The first batch, from May 22 to June 02, 2023, had 26 participants, including 12 Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs) and 13 farmers. The second batch, held on June 19-28, 2023, involved 19 participants, including 3 AEWs. These sessions provided a structured learning environment, facilitating practical application and empowering individuals to disseminate information effectively in their communities or workplaces.

Furthermore, to establish or improve participants' current farm enterprises, making them more financially lucrative. Four Season Long Farm Business School training sessions took place in Gingoog City (20 participants), Manolo Fortich, Bukidnon (20 participants), Opol, Misamis Oriental (20 participants) and Sultan Naga Dimaporo, Lanao Del Norte (23 participants).

Continuing Professional Development

To further professionalize the agricultural sector, the conducted training has been accredited with CPD points by the PRC. In 2023, from the 54 training courses of ATI-RTC X intended for AEW's, 43 (80%) of which were accredited with CPD points.

Scholarship Programs

EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE YOUTH IN AGRICULTURE (EASY Agri)

For the year 2023, a total of 49 students from Central Mindanao University (CMU), Mindanao State University (MSU) in Marawi and Naawan, and University of Science and Technology of Southern Philippines (USTP) - Claveria pursuing Bachelor of Science in Agriculture and Bachelor of Science in Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering were granted of EAsY Agri Scholarship.

EDUCATIONAL GRANT FOR EXTENSION WORKERS (EdGE)

Providing access to educational opportunities will serve as catalyst for staying updated on the latest agricultural practices, technologies, and innovations. With the support of ATI-RTC X, there are eight agricultural extension workers scholars pursuing their Masters and Doctorate Degrees.



FY 2023 YEAR-END ASSESSMENT FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

The FY 2023 Year-End Assessment for the Educational Assistance for the Youth in Agriculture (EAsY Agri) and Educational Grant for Extension Workers (EdGE) Scholarship Programs took place at TIEZA-Gardens of Malasag, Cugman, Cagayan de Oro City on December 27-28, 2023. This semestral assessment served as a platform for scholars to address concerns, share their actions, and provide recommendations. Ms. Maria Lydia A. Echavez, Center Director, and Scholarship Program Focal Person reviewed the Scholarship Guidelines and reiterated scholars' obligations and responsibilities.

The Local Scholarship Committee recognized exceptional students for their prompt submission of scholarship monthly reports. Certificates of merit were awarded to scholars who achieved a GPA higher than 1.5, including Jay Marie B. Generalao, Ayah B. Alido, Jose Mei W. Barrio, Starlyn B. Pasco, and Ma. Joylyn H. Yaconas. This acknowledgment underscores the commitment to academic excellence and overall achievement within the scholarship programs.

YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM IN ORGANIC AGRICULTURE

The Youth Scholarship Grant on Organic Farming (YSGOF) structured as a specialized internship initiative, aims to foster an appreciation for organic agriculture and empower young individuals to embrace organic entrepreneurship.

ATI-RTC X supports five scholars who recently showcased their refined project visions and a strong commitment to excellence during the Project Proposal Presentation held on November 19, 2023. They were stationed to selected LSAs in the region to grasp first-hand experience on the agriculture technologies and practices for nine months.

Currently, the scholars are on their individual farms to implement their presented projects.







Internship Programs

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE INTERNSHIPS

Filipino Young Farmers Internship Program (FYFIP) in Taiwan

Four alumni of the Filipino Young Farmers Internship Program in Taiwan Batch 2 from Region 10 have secured a financial grant of Php 150,000 each to support their proposed business initiatives aligned with the ATI's goal of empowering young Filipino farmers to apply their skills and knowledge in agribusiness. As the 3rd batch of interns is currently engaged in their assignments in Taiwan, the 4th batch has progressed with the National Written Examination, with 10 applicants successfully passing.



On the other hand, two young-farmers from Northern Mindanao - Mr. Neil Christian Dave Pio of Alubijid and Mr. Patrick Tomonglay of Claveria, Misamis Oriental, participated in a learning opportunity in Japan as part of Batch 2023. This initiative aims to enhance their farming skills and expertise, providing them with valuable experiences for the advancement of their agricultural careers. Concurrently, Batch 2024 has commenced field validation and interviews for applicants who successfully passed the National Written Exam of the Young Filipino Farmer Leaders Training Program in Japan.

To prepare the interns for their training, they undergo basic training and field activities on farm management at selected Learning Sites for Agriculture in Misamis Oriental.

ON-THE JOB TRAINEES

ATI-RTC X facilitated a diverse range of On-the-Job Training (OJT) and Work Immersion programs with a total of 49 trainees across various educational institutions. The programs spanned different courses and durations, contributing to hands-on experiences for students in Public Administration, BS Agriculture, Development Communication, BS Extension Education, BSBA Marketing Management, BS Entrepreneurship, and the STEM Strand for Senior High School students. These initiatives aimed to provide valuable practical knowledge and skills to the trainees, fostering their development in the agricultural sector.

PRIVATE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES EXTENSION SERVICE PROVIDER (PAF-ESP)



ATI-RTC X maintains its collaborative efforts with ESPs through Capability Enhancement initiatives. In the current year, two accredited PAF-ESP entities, Queensland Herbs and Tourist Farm and Greenminds Incorporated, successfully conducted Capability Enhancement programs.

The Department of Agriculture and its attached agencies aim to enhance efforts for a nationally-coherent food security program, emphasizing sustainability in agricultural productivity. The Agricultural Training Institute (DA-ATI) commits to multi-stakeholder capacity development in agriculture and food production, targeting Regional Training Centers, Local Government Units, Learning Sites for Agriculture, and various community-based stakeholders. The goal is to increase local stakeholder participation in the development and promotion of the agriculture and fisheries sector, fostering vibrant local agricultural and food production for sustainable Philippine agricultural systems.

As part of DA-ATI's interventions, the focus includes establishing sustainable sources of planting materials, engaging stakeholders to ensure access to viable and high-quality seedling materials in various communities, and promoting long-term crop availability and production. In line with these objectives, a specific project was implemented at five sites in Iligan City, two in Cagayan de Oro City, Gingoog City, and Malaybalay City.

The project involves the establishment and enhancement of nurseries to serve as sources of planting materials and seedlings for distribution, contributing to the overall goal of achieving safe, nutritious, and affordable food for all in the Philippines.

INSPIRE PROJECTS

The Department of Agriculture's National Livestock Program is actively supporting the Integrated National Swine Production Initiatives for Recovery and Expansion (INSPIRE) program, emphasizing the creation of sustainable sources for high-quality hog genetics to enhance local production. This initiative aims to provide accessible, quality hogs to farmers nationwide, contributing to the resilience, recovery, and expansion of the swine production sector.



CAMIGUIN



BUKIDNON

A 60-sow level Swine Multiplier and Demo Farm was inaugurated in Cabanglasan, Bukidnon. Moreover, right after the event, the Department of Agriculture - Regional Field Office X also turned-over the stocks to be raised on the multiplier farm. The project aims to establish a credible supply of stocks not only in Cabanglasan but for the whole province as well and opens a lot of swine raising and agribusiness opportunities in the neighboring municipalities.

ONLINE ADVISORIES

Notably, there were 252 inquiries via online and phone calls about farm technologies and training. Additionally, 50 clients sought information on seed acquisition and participated in activities related to program renewal, receiving orientation and briefings on the LSA program.

RICE CROP MANAGER

Digital transformation is playing a pivotal role in advancing agriculture. In alignment with the Department of Agriculture's initiatives, the Rice Crop Manager (RCM) stands out as a key tool, promoting sustainable and efficient rice farming practices. This contribution extends to enhancing productivity and livelihoods within the rice farming communities of the Philippines.

Moreover, a Training of Trainers on Rice Crop Manager Advisory Services (RCMAS) was carried out, involving 20 participants primarily from Bukidnon, and some from Lanao Del Norte and Misamis Oriental. This training aimed to empower farmers with site-specific, one-page fertilizer and management recommendations through RCMAS. Participants utilized GPS technology to measure their farm lots. This commitment underscores the dedication of agricultural professionals to effectively harness technology and empower farmers through skill-building initiatives.











KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT

ATI-RTC X continues to stand as knowledge bank committed in empowering AEWs, farmers, agripreneurs, and stakeholders across the agricultural spectrum. SCHOOL-ON-THE-AIR (SOA) PROGRAM

The School on the Air program led by the Information Services Section is a distance learning program on agriculture and fisheries related topics. The topics are aired through a nearby radio station covering the targeted provinces or cities/municipalities.

For 2023, ATI-RTC X has conducted 3 School on the Air Programs, namely:

The Wais na Wais sa Mais SOA program was aired at WRK 96.9 FM in Kauswagan Lanao del Norte from June-October 2024, with a total of 607 farmer graduates. It was held in the Province of Lanao del Norte particularly in the Municipality of Kauswagan as the main target municipality based on their letter of request. It was also participated by the nearby municipalities of Matungao, Munai, Bacolod.

The SOA-SRA Program, in its third year, was likewise held in the Province of Lanao del Norte via hook up with the main radio station at Friends Radio 96.7 FMR in Iligan City from July-August 2023 with a total of 2,510 participants.

Moreover, for the SOA on Coconut, it was conducted together with the full coordination of the Philippine Coconut Authority in Region 10 from August-September 2023 and was aired at Radyo Rapido 92.9 FM in Agay-Ayan, Gingoog City, Misamis Oriental. A total of 550 coconut farmers were enrolled in the said program.











TECHNO GABAY PROGRAM









This year is one of the most active years for the Techno Gabay Program's implementation in region 10, as to capacity-building of FITS Staff and expanding reach of information and dissemination through the establishment of more FITS Centers and FITS Kiosks in the region.







Establishment of FITS Centers and Kiosks

At present, there are 63 FITS Centers, all operational across the region, and three (3) among 63 were established this year. Two (2) out of the three (3) FITS established this year are from Bukidnon. As of October 2023, there are a total of 21 out of the 22 municipalities of Bukidnon are with FITS Centers.

The yearly appreciation and reward approach of ATI-RTC X to the top performing FITS Centers came into fruition when numbers of FITS Centers have initiated their establishment of FITS Kiosks in their respective municipalities.

As of October 30, 2023, 140 FITS Kiosks were established in the region, of which majority were established through the initiatives of LGU and PLGU-FITS.

Capacity-building for FITS Staff

ATI-RTC X has conducted three (3) batches of the Training on Digitalized Knowledge Product Development. The trainings were attended by FITS Center Staff and LSA FITS Kiosk staff tandem from all over the region. The training taught the FITS Center staff and FITS Kiosks staff to develop and produce their techno-based and promotional materials in the forms of brochures and short videos which they could make available online for easy retrieval when they needed to print more IECs for their library, and for their clients' easy access through their social media accounts.

Most of the contents of the outputs of the trainings were agriculture practices of the LSAs or promotional material for their farm, with these, the partnership was also established between the LGU-FITS and LSA FITS in terms of documentation, development, packaging, and dissemination of agri-info materials. There were 35 techno-based and promotional brochures developed through the training, and nine (9) will be funded and reproduced in 2024.





The ATI-RTC X spearheaded by its Information Services Section (ISS) conducted a virtual graduation for the 843 students who completed various e-courses in 2021 through the e-Learning of the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI).

From the 843 graduates, 747 of which were students from Central Mindanao University (CMU) while 96 were from the Misamis Occidental National High School.

The e-Learning component of the e-Extension program, is an online learning platform that offers e-courses on agriculture and fisheries designed for students, farmers, fishers, agricultural extension workers and enthusiasts. However, last year, the program took some downtime due to its upgrading, system maintenance, as well as updating of the e-courses.

DIGITAL FARMERS PROGRAM

LSA Owner Mr. Recarte Bacus, of Candiisan Diversified Farm in Malaybalay City Bukidnon, together with the City Agriculture Office of Malaybalay City conducted the 1st DFP rollout in the Region last September 20, 2023. This rollout is a realization of their re-entry plan when they attended the DFP 101-102 TOT on September 2022.

ATI-RTC X has maintained its strong partnership with SMART Communications. Ms. Judy Chaves, Smart Communications Mindanao Relations, was invited to grace the opening program through an opening message during of the TOT on DFP on June 6-9, 2023.

Before the conduct of the DFP SATS and DFP Farm Connect, the Information Services Section conducted a coordination meeting with the target farmers association beneficiary, the Sto Niño Organic Rice Farmers Association (SNORFA) in Malaybalay City Bukidnon. The discussion revolved on the identification of demo site for the drone seeding, and the target date of conduct in line with their planting schedule.

Majority of this year's participants for the TOT on DFP are FITS Center representatives across the Region. The means of selecting the participants is in preparation of the devolution of the Mandanas Ruling where trainings for farmers will be conducted by the AEWs. The participants who are best in microteaching were awarded with android tablets and hard drive that their FITS Centers may use in delivering their extension services to the farmers.

PARTNERSHIPS

Partnership among ATI-RTC X, the government, and NGOs create a synergistic relationship that maximizes the strengths of each entity. By combining resources, expertise, and networks, this collaboration drives sustainable agricultural development, enhance resilience in farming communities, and contribution to broader national development goals.

ENHANCED PARTNERSHIP AGAINST HUNGER AND POVERTY (EPAHP)

ATI-RTC X renews Partnership with the Regional Convergence Team for Enhanced Partnership Against Hunger and Poverty. The partnership was concluded through the ceremonial signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) held on June 23, 2023 at Chali Beach Resort in Cugman, Cagayan de Oro City.

Among the beneficiaries, the Paglaum Sustainable Livelihood Program Farmer Association Barangay San Luis, Gingoog City, Misamis Oriental and Maharlika Vermicast Sustainable Livelihood Program Farmer Association in Barangay Kawit Oriental, Kauswagan, Lanao del Norte and MTMH SLP Farmers Association in Barangay Bayanga, Cagayan de Oro City are actively involved in projects supported by the Department of Social Welfare and Development Enhanced Partnership Against Hunger and Poverty (EPAHP) initiative and ATI-RTC X. With financial aid, they have implemented initiatives like Rice Trading and Vegetable Communal Gardening and Vermicomposting, fostering community resilience through Cash-for-Work programs. ATI-RTC X conducted this project in collaboration with LGU- Municipal/City Agriculture Office.

ATI-RTC X has provided training and materials for the establishment and maintenance of communal vegetable garden, contributing to the associations' sustainability. These collaborative efforts aim to empower the beneficiaries, alleviate poverty, and address hunger as part of EPAHP's comprehensive approach for sustainable development. The Farmers Associations or CBOs established in Cagayan de Oro City and Gingoog City signed a marketing agreement with DSWD for their vegetable produce.









REGIONAL TASK FORCE TO END LOCAL COMMUNIST ARMED CONFLICT (RTF-ELCAC)

ATI-RTC X conducted the training on urban gardening in partnership with 10th Intelligence and Security Unit, AIR, Philippine Army headed by their Commanding Officer Major Primo G. Dawiguey Jr. (INF) in Camp Evangelista, Patag, Cagayan de Oro City.



The training was conducted as part of their flagship program called Military Livelihood Education (MILE) purposely to increase the knowledge and skills of their personnel and dependents in urban gardening as a livelihood that can provide them an extra source of income.

ELCAC - Poverty Reduction, Livelihood and Employment Cluster (ELCAC-PRLEC)



In an effort to revitalize the "No Man's Land" of Sitio Kalhaan in Barangay Minalwang, Claveria, Misamis Oriental, a transformative initiative took place through targeted training programs. From March 7-9, 2023, members of the Higaonon tribe participated in a four-day training on Organic Herbs Production, Utilization, and Processing. Led by Green Minds Incorporated CEO Datu Makadingding and project officer Lonalyn Amper Sulatan, the training equipped the tribe with knowledge on identifying local herbs, propagation techniques, and soil media preparation.

The hands-on trainings included the preparation of teas, infusions, and herbal remedies, with the goal of not only fostering herbal propagation but also creating additional income sources for the community. This initiative exemplifies a concerted effort to bring essential services closer to the people, breathing life into a once-neglected area.

PROVINCE-LED AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES EXTENSION SYSTEM (PAFES)



ATI-RTC X has led 9 capacity building activities in support to PAFES in the Provinces of Misamis Oriental and Camiguin.

With a strong collaboration among local government units, private entities and support from various agencies in the region highlight a comprehensive approach to agricultural development, ensuring the success and resilience of farming communities in the region.

Additionally, the rearing of stingless bees training program was organized in partnership with GreenMinds, Inc. that showcases innovative practices and involvement of former OFWs in beekeeping, contributing to the region's diversified and sustainable agricultural landscape.

OUT-OF-SCHOOL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT ALLIANCE (OSYDA)

The ATI-RTC X, in collaboration with the Agricultural Productivity and Organization Office (APOO), is actively strengthening the capacities of Out-of-School Youths (OSY) in Cagayan de Oro City, with a focus on providing services related to agricultural production, value-adding, marketing, and other agriculture-related skills training.

In support of the Out-of-School Youth Development Alliance (OSYDA), a comprehensive series of training programs were conducted. These included a three-day Digital Marketing training, a separate three-day Organizational Capacity Development Training, and another three-day session focused on enhancing the value-adding skills of young farmers and fisherfolk entrepreneurs. Each training, engaging 25 youths from Cagayan de Oro City, contributed to equipping them with essential skills, ensuring their development and empowerment within the OSYDA framework.





4-H CLUB

To enhance youth's knowledge of agricultural technologies, foster leadership, and artistic skills, the center successfully conducted Regional 4-H Youth Camp from July 25-27, 2023. The event, attended by seventy 4-H'ers and their coordinators from Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental, Bukidnon, and Iligan City, revolved around the theme "4-H EVOLVE: Expanding the Value of Leadership and Values Over 70 Years of 4-H Excellence." The camp provided a platform for active engagement of youth in agriculture-related fields and sought to achieve its objectives by promoting knowledge sharing, reinforcing 4-H convictions, and encouraging healthy competition.



NOMCAARRD

NORTHERN MINDANAO CONSORTIUM FOR AGRICULTURE, AQUATIC AND NATURAL RESOURCES RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

ATI-RTC X maintains its partnership with NOMCAARRD in implementing the DOST-PCAARRD banner programs in strategic research and development, capability building, and advancing the agriculture, aquatic, and natural resources sectors in Northern Mindanao.

Moreover, key discussions during their 135th NOMCAARRD RRDCC Meeting last December 12, 2023 includes report on the Training-Writeshop on Proposal Packaging and Development, resulting significant achievements such as drafting of 12 R&D proposals, 4 TechTrans proposals, submission of 16 re-entry plans, and development of a training program.

Management Review and Assessment
