



# EXCELLENT EXTENSION Services BEYOND BOUNDARIES



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As the capacity builder and catalyst of the extension system, the Agricultural Training Institute in Central Luzon (ATI-CL) has been implementing quality training activities to help develop the skills and knowledge of the stakeholders, agricultural extension workers (AEWs), farmers, and fishers in the region.









#### Regular

The following are the activities under the Regular Program in 2021:

 Seven (7) batches of e-Know-Vation 2021:
 An e-Learning Orientation via Google Meet from February to December 2021

The Agricultural Training Institute – Central Luzon (ATI-CL) partnered with seven (7) State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) in each province in Central Luzon in the implementation of e-Learning orientation among 100 students per SUC through a webinar. The said SUCs and schedule are as follows:

The activity maximized the use of Information, Communication, and Education (ICT) materials such as desktops, laptops, and smartphones in learning different agricultural technologies and rural development in a web-based platform at any pace, any place, and any time.

The students finished three (3) e-Learning courses: the Basic Urban Gardening course to promote the production of food at their respective homes, one (1) social technology course, one (1) course of their choice to complete the activity.

e-Learning has been a component of the Agricultural Training Institute's e-Extension Program for Agriculture and Fisheries. It has been serving ATI's platform to offer alternative means of acquiring new knowledge and skills on agriculture and fisheries since 2007.

e-Learning also offers courses on different topics ranging from crops, social technology, livestock & poultry, sustainable agriculture, and fisheries. After finishing a course, the online user will immediately receive a certificate.

The Center has strategically conducted seven (7) batches (DFP 101 & 102) in the region to





cater all provinces. In 2021, the seven (7) batches of DFP 102 were implemented from August 24 to September 24, 2021 via Google Meet to continuously provide digital literacy among farmers and youth in Central Luzon. Specifically, the schedule of implementation is as follows:

Under the program, the senior farmers or LSA cooperators and their younger, more techsavvy learning partners, undergone online training on basic digital tools and technologies, particularly social media, climate and weather monitoring applications, and e-farming, among others.

By partnering senior farmers with young people, preferably their children or a relative, the ATI-CL is optimistic that the program will encourage the youth to engage into farming.

Among the topics being discussed in the level two journey are the DFP lessons on advanced agri apps, advanced social media marketing, e-Commerce platform and introduction to Pay Maya. As part of the program, the Center also conducted contests such as poster contest which the participants made using the Canva app.

DFP 102 is an instrument for the advancement of farming by transitioning transactions and promotions online especially the use of the modern technology in farmers present farming system.

The DFP is a project between the Agricultural Training Institute (DA-ATI) and SMART Communications, Inc. which consists of a ladderized approach in teaching small—scale farmers nationwide with basic digital tools and technologies, particularly social media.

The project aims to be a precursor to the Government's goal on advancing the local industry's adoption to more advance forms of technology in farming such as---the use of drones, analytics, precision farming, A.I., climate and weather monitoring I.T. solutions, digital apps, e-money, blockchain, and other multi-layer platforms---that would necessitate basic knowledge of emerging technologies and deeper comprehension of its potential by its end-users.

Three (3) batches of Training Course on Climate Resilient Farm Business School (CRFBS) on March 8-17, 2021; June 7-17, 2021; November 8-26, 2021; with 57 participants for the said batches;

The Agricultural Training Institute-Central Luzon (ATI-CL), in partnership with Villar SIPAG Foundation. conducted three (3) batches of the 10-day training entitled Climate Resilient Farm Business School (CRFBS) on March 8-17, 2021; June 7-17, 2021; and November 8-26, 2021 in City of San Fernando, Pampanga with 57 participants for the said batches.

Two batches of 3-day virtual training were implemented on October 20 – 22, 2021, and October 27 – 29, 2021, respectively, which included two courses per batch: the DAC 101 and DAC 102.

The DAC 101 focused on the use of smartphones, a step-by-step guide on how to access the internet, internet safety and security, basic ICT Tools in rice farming, and introduction to social media marketing.

Moreover, the DAC 102 is an upgraded course that emphasized more agri-apps and websites, advanced social media marketing, poster making through Canva, e-Commerce, and online payment transaction.

Mr. Aeron P. Bermudez, Mr. Kent Edward S. Ballesteros, Mr. John Led G. Joaquin, and Ms. Eula Dee A. Lañada served as the resource persons in both DAC 101 and DAC 102.

The said training is anchored with the Rice Extension Services Program of Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund and is expected to be rolled out as part of a training course under Farmers' Field School of RCEF.

#### **Livestock Program**

Under the Livestock Program, the center implemented the following activities in 2021:

AgriTalk 2021 Livestock Webinar Series

For the conduct of AgriTalk in the region, the Center has partnered with Learning Sites for Agriculture (LSAs) for the implementation of the activity. Each LSA has tapped farmers within their respective communities, specifically members of farmers group or association, to become participants of the said event. After the activity, these farmer-participants will also receive extension support related to the discussed topic to start their farming journey.

For the awarded extension support, it is partnered with a center-developed monitoring tool to record the status of their awards as well as it could be used as basis for research. The tools are collected 6 months after the duration of the project.

In addition, ATI-CL has tapped selected LSA cooperators as resource persons of the event. Their lectures are recorded to avoid any technical difficulties since it is implemented online.

In 2021, ATI-CL featured topics under the livestock program dubbed as "Hanep sa Kwentuhan, Hayop sa Kaalaman: AgriTalk 2021 Livestock Webinar Series" which included topics on goat raising and management, rabbitry, and free-range chicken production.

The said topics were discussed by LSA cooperators namely: (1) Mr. Randy O. Valerio of R.O. Valerio Farm based at Bacolor, Pampanga; (2) Mr. George N. Nativiad of Jabez Marketing Corporation based at San Jose City, Nueva Ecija; and (3) Mr. Emmanuel S. Bundoc of Felisidro Farm based at Pulilan, Bulacan, respectively.

AgriTalk is a free webinar series that provides an avenue for different individual and group of agriculture practitioners who share their success and failures in their agribusiness. It also seeks to inspire other farmers, professionals, students and enthusiasts.

The series, which was aired at ATI Central Luzon's Facebook Page on June 21-23, 2021 at one o'clock in the afternoon, aims to continuously bring agriculture seminars closer to its clients at the comforts of their home.

The Agricultural Training Institute-Central Luzon (ATI-CL), through the initiative of the Office of Senator Grace Poe (OSGP), opened opportunities for the youth of Nueva Ecija through the implementation of the Binhi ng Pagasa Program (BPP).

ATI-CL, OSGP, with the help and support of Provincial Government of Nueva Ecija, implemented two (2) batches of provincial training entitled "Training of Trainers on Goat and Free-Range Chicken Production for Binhing Pag-asa Program Beneficiaries" on August 3-6, 2021 and August 10-13, 2021, respectively, held in ATI-RTC III, Satellite Office in Brgy. Singalat, Palayan City.

Among the resource speakers for the conducted provincial trainings were Dr. Mark Arman Aquino-Planning Officer III and Elenita F. Casimiro-Agricultural Center Chief of Provincial Veterinary Office, Lily Dela Cruz-Agriculturist II from ATI-RTC III, and Leaross Lourdes Valerio,

Vicente Leido IV, Sofia Anne Santiago, and Kelvin Reuven Sanguir, Political Officers from OSGP.

At the end of the training, the participants submitted an action plan of their proposed project for their respective communities which served as their main requirement for receiving their individual agricultural starter-kits (goats and free-range chicken) worth Php13,500.00.

As completers of provincial training, the 37 youth participants are expected to share and use their learnings to help every youth in their respective communities to engage in agriculture. With this, apart from their agriculture modules, trainings on leadership and values formation were provided to prepare them to be the future leaders of their generation.

The province of Nueva Ecija was one of the chosen provinces for this year's program alongside Aklan Albay, Camarines Sur and Davao de Oro, following its first implementation in 2017.

These training activities under the BPP are instrumental in fulfilling the goal of gradually mending the constant decline of Filipinos engaged in agriculture, alongside the growing generational gap among farmers:

- Seventeen (17) batches of Training on Goat and Free-Range Chicken Production for Binhi ng Pag-Asa Program Beneficiaries in Palayan City, Nueva Ecija from August 16 until October 29, 2021; and
- Binhi ng Pag-asa Regional Summit (online) on November 24-26, 2021.

Further, the Northwind Fine Herd International, Inc., and Kapampangan Development Foundation Inc. Farm were certified under HVCDP.


#### **Urban Garden**

Ms. Esmenia S. Lulu, City Agriculturist of Palayan City and Ms. Elsa F. Victoria, OIC-Training Center Superintendent I, signed the MOA as Grantor and Grantee of the said project.

Dr. Dianne M. Lapuz, Project Officer of the said Community Urban Garden, shared to the 4-H club members their responsibilities in establishing their Community Urban Garden. She encouraged the 4-H club members as the recipients of the project to help one another for it to become successful and sustain the said endeavor.

Lulu encouraged the beneficiaries to be involved and pour out their hearts in establishing their Community Urban Garden. In addition, she said that the young generation should always have a positive outlook in life and be a good steward of the blessings they have received and will receive in the near future.

In addition, the group received assorted IEC materials about urban gardening, free-range chicken production and other technologies and practices in Organic Agriculture. They also received initial garden tools, vegetable seeds, seedling trays, and seedling bag.

Further, Mr. Christopher Ryan G. Banaag, Agriculturist II, 4-H and Organic Agriculture Focal Person of Palayan City, said that they are always will to assist

the group from planning until the successful operation of their Community Urban Garden. Banaag is also the coordinator of the said project.

## Filipino Young Farmer Internship Program

Two (2) young Central Luzon farmers left the Philippines on October 2, 2021 to undergo 11-month internship in Taiwan as part of the Filipino Young Farmer Internship Program (FYFIP) in partnership with Manila Economic and Cultural Office (MECO) and Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in the Philippines (TECO).

As one of the requirements for the internship program, Mr. Ceejay Gayap of Science City of Muñoz, Nueva Ecija and Mr. Marc Danielle Rodriguez of Hermosa, Bataan completed their Online Pre-Departure Orientation Course which started from April until August 2021.

Gayap and Rodriguez passed the national examination and interview for the said internship earlier this year. The Department of Agriculture – Agricultural Training Institute (DA-ATI) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with MECO-TECO in December 2020 enhancing the existing friendly relations between the agriculture and fishery authorities.

The MOU provides for an 11-month subsidized internship program in Taiwan for qualified young Filipino farmers. The training module will include modern agricultural and fisheries techniques, marketing strategies, cooperative management, enhancement of competencies, discipline and work values, among others.

#### Magsasaka Siyentista (MS)

The Agricultural Training Institute-Central Luzon (ATI-CL) hosted the online Techno Gabay Program (TGP) meeting via Google Meet among the region's TGP working group on March 30, 2021.


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




























ATI-Central Luzon coordinated with AgriPreneur TV for the LSAs in the region to be featured in the said TV program. The show depicts the salient features of the farm, their technologies and it aims to inspire individuals to start their own farms.

More than 50 LSAs have been featured in AgriPreneur TV since 2020 and the LSA cooperators have also been interviewed by Mr. Jiggy Manicad in his online show.

In addition, our Center Director has also been interviewed for the plans and programs of ATI for 2021.

With the established relationship, the director for the AgriPreneur TV show has been tapped as a resource person of the Center for Click & Capture: Smartphone Photography & Videography Training for ATI staff which was held in February 2021.

# **FITS Center Enhancement**

ATI-CL has enhanced three (3) Farmers Information and Technology Services (FITS) Centers in the region under Rice Crop Manager (RCM) through the provision of ICT equipment. As recommended by their provincial TGP coordinators, the following are the FITS Centers enhanced in 2021:

- 1. FITS Guimba, Nueva Ecija;
- 2. FITS Victoria, Tarlac; and
- 3. OPA-Bulacan.

IEC materials were also granted to the said FITS Centers as they are our partner in the dissemination in the region.



### **FITS Center Establishment**

ATI-CL has launched the Farmers' Information and Technology Services (FITS) Center in Pantabangan, Nueva Ecija on December 16, 2021 to provide fast access of latest agriculture and agriculture-related information.

ATI-CL and the local government unit (LGU) of Pantabangan, Nueva Ecija entered into a Memorandum of Agreement to signify the commitment of both parties in serving the farmers in the community. A ribbon-cutting and blessing of the newly-established FITS Center followed.

With the establishment of FITS Center, LGU Pantabangan received ICT equipment such as printer, smart TV, portable sound system, tablet, pocket wifi, external hard drive, GPS, and supplies to help the operation of its services under the Techno Gabay Program (TGP).

The FITS Center also received various information, education and communication (IEC) materials related to agriculture to be distributed to farmers within the community.

Dr. Jovita Agliam of the Office of the Provincial Agriculturist-Nueva Ecija; Ms. Janet L. Saturno of the Central Luzon State University Extension Office; Ms. Glenda Valderrama of CLAARRDEC attended the said event. In addition, 10 farmer-leaders in Pantabangan also participated in the activity.

The FITS Center is a one-stop service facility made accessible to farmers, enterpreneurs, and other clients in a given area. The FITS Center is one of the components of the Techno Gabay Program along with Magsasaka Siyentista (MS), Information & Communications Technology (ICT), and Information, Education and Communication (IEC).

# FITS Center Enhancement through Agriculture Magazine Subscription

A total of 48 FITS Centers and Knowledge Resource Center (KRC) in Central Luzon has been enhanced through the subscription of Agriculture Magazine.

### LSA FITS Kiosk Establishment

The center also initiated the establishment of ten (10) LSA FITS Kiosks in the region. With the establishment, the said LSA FITS Kiosks provided an area in their respective farms for the display area and IEC materials. Moreover, ATI-CL granted them with ICT equipment and supplies to be used in their activities under the Techno Gabay Program (TGP) and as an LSA.

Further, the LSA FITS Kiosks have agreed to conduct e-Learning orientation among their farmer-participants and they will produce 100 graduates per year until the duration of the project.

# **Partnerships**

Partnership with Pagalanggang National High School (NHS) for e-Learning & OA courses institutionalization

ATI-CL has entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the institutionalization of e-Learning and organic agriculture (OA) courses to Pagalanggang National High School (PNHS) on March 26, 2021.

PNHS entered this partnership because the enrollees of the school in Technical Vocational Learning-Agriculture (TVL-Agri) want to become farmers thus they have forged a relationship with ATI to help them in providing adequate knowledge in the field.

During the activity, PNHS presented the immersion program of the students as well as their expectations of the said partnership. ATI also discussed the e-Learning program highlighting the courses which the students could take. In addition, an overview of the Organic Agriculture (OA) program was discussed.

With the partnership, PNHS will send students to ATI-CL for their work immersion program





every year and in turn, ATI-CL will introduce e-Learning and OA courses to them.

# Partnership with Malolos City in adopting hydroponics system for community urban gardening

ATI-CL entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with LGU and FITS Center Malolos City through its OIC-City Agriculturist, Romeo S. Bartolo, L.Mngt., LAgr. for the Community Urban Garden on December 2, 2021.

Through the MOA, ATI-CL shall provide a hydroponics NFT (Nutrient Film Technique) System which shall be showcased in the heart of the City of Malolos, Barangay Bulihan, Malolos City.

This shall serve as the prototype and basis for subsequent implementation in the first five barangays namely San Pablo, Bagong Bayan, Sta. Maria Trinidad, Bagna, and Atlag.

The idea of promoting the hydroponics system of food production was the offshoot of the Online Training on Micro Gardening Online training conducted by ATI-CL on October 19-21, 2021 which was aired live via Facebook, where 827 registered in the said online training.

The majority of the viewers and participants showed interest in the hydroponics system (wick type, Dutch bucket, and NFT systems).
