agrikultura. Labing-tatlong LSA ang sumali sa expo na kinabibilangan ng:

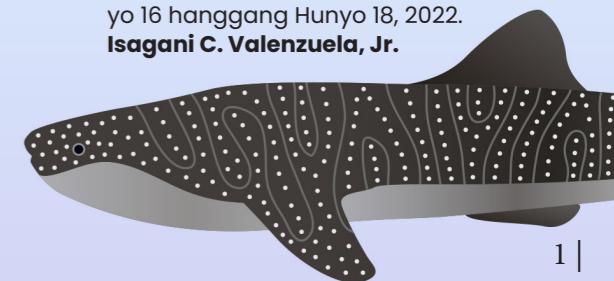

## DA-ATI Bicol Holds TOT on Mango Production and Post-Harvest Handling in Masbate



### MASBATE CITY, Masbate

"Our goal is to be the top producing mango in the Philippines by enhancing our cultural management practices and postharvest handling."

said Provincial Agriculturist Engr. Jonel B. Orteza during the opening program of the Training of Trainers on Mango Production and Postharvest Handling with GAD Concepts. He challenged the participants to be the hope of the mango industry in Masbate.

The main objective of the training is to increase the production volume of mangoes in Masbate

through extensive awareness and education of agricultural extension workers. It was supported under the Provincial Commodity Investment Plan (PCIP).

Mr. Emmanuel Orogo, ATI Bicol High-Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP) Point Person, stressed the importance of the training that has 15 Continuing Professional Development units. He shared that this is part of the professionalization effort of the Center to its clientele.

Additionally, Ms. Cita F. Cana, the provincial HVCDP coordinator, discussed the Philippine Mango Industry overview and its management practices. Among the sub-topics were quality planting materials, land prepara-

tion, design and distance of planting, cultural management of young and bearing trees, and flower induction and management. Provincial Mango Coordinator Mr. Kenth Reynard Munoz talked about cultural management practices. He addressed subtopics that included proper harvesting, storage facilities, integrated pest and disease management, fertilizer management, pesticide management, farm management, and worker's health, safety, and welfare.

Ms. Kristine Rebaya of the Technological Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA)- Masbate demonstrated mango food processing by making a mango jam. She discussed the step-by-step process, and

The largest and the most challenging event the DA-ATI Bicol held by far.

In collaboration with the Department of Agriculture-Regional Field Office 5, the Rice Board, the local government of Bula, Camarines Sur, and private agricultural companies, the DA-ATI Bicol staged the 14th National Rice Technology Forum (NRTF) at the Brgy. San Ramon, Bula, Camarines

Sur from April 19-22, 2022.

The NRTF showcases modern technologies, practices, and strategies aimed at enhancing production, raising income, and reducing costs in line with the DA's slogan of 'Masaganang Ani. Mataas na Kita.'

With the theme, "Increase Production through Hybrid Rice Technology," more than 3,000 farmers, national

and local government agriculture officials, rice focal persons, experts, and marketers flocked to the 105-hectare techno farm of San Agustin San Ramon Agrarian Reform Farmers Cooperative (SARFC) that showcases hybrid rice technologies. In addition, forums on hybrid rice technology, farm and fishery clustering and consolidation (f2c2), balanced fertilization, and drone technology were held at the

# DA-ATI Bicol Supports GOLDEN RICE in Bicol

**VIRAC, Catanduanes** - To support the acceleration and expansion of Golden Rice seed production in the Bicol, the DA-ATI Bicol has inked a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), the DA-Regional Field Office V (DA-RFO V), the DA-Bureau of Plant Industry (DA-BPI), the Lone District Representative of Catanduanes, the Provincial Government of Catanduanes and the Municipal Governments of Viga and Virac.

Golden Rice is a type of rice that contains beta-carotene, a source of Vitamin A. It aims to address the Vitamin A deficiency (VAD), the leading cause of preventable childhood blindness worldwide. Based on studies, Golden Rice can provide 30-50% of the estimated average requirement (EAR) for children and women of reproductive age. It is intended to complement existing nutrition interventions to address VAD.

The province of Catanduanes has been chosen as the sole province

in the Bicol Region, where the Golden will be initially produced and distributed. It will be done in the municipalities of Virac and Viga.

Governor Joseph Cua welcomed the initiative. "The province of Catanduanes is honored and humbled to be selected as a pilot province for the launching of this program... We recognize that this program is important in making sure we are food-sufficient. It also addresses the issue of child malnutrition," he

stated.

Governor Cua led the MOA signing. ATI Bicol Center Director Elsa Parot, who was on official business, was represented by this writer. Aside from the MOA signing, there was also a ceremonial handover of Golden Rice seed materials to the farmers.

## NABUA, Camarines Sur

**Seed growers play a vital role in the rice seed supply system. By producing high-quality inbred rice seeds, they are the key players in agricultural production. They widen and maintain genetic diversity in their fields, thus setting the ground for seed exchange and improvement of inbred rice varieties.**

Compared with farmer-saved seeds from the previous harvest, certified inbred seeds distributed under Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (RCEF) gives at least 10% higher yield as these seeds have high seedling vigor, purity, and uniform crop stand.

To serve more farmers, there is need to train more potential seed producers.

As the capability builder, knowledge builder,

and catalyst of extension system, ATI Bicol conducted a five-day training course on Inbred Rice Seed Production, Certification, and Quality Control for Potential Seed Growers with Gender and Development (GAD) Concepts. This was conducted at Macagang Business Center in Nabua, Camarines Sur on February 21-25, 2022 with on-site practicum and hands-on sessions at DA-Regional Field Office No. 5 (DA-RFO 5).

Exactly 30 potential seed growers from various provinces in the Bicol Region were equipped with knowledge about mechanics, policies, and guidelines on seed certification for inbred rice seed production; role of seed growers; cultural management practices of inbred rice seed production; seed testing methods, procedures, and laboratory standards.

They were provided with field-based learning

on field inspection and rouging, seed piling, tagging, and sampling, seed testing methods, procedures, and laboratory standards such as moisture content determination, physical purity test, varietal test, and germination test.

DA-RFO 5) and the Bureau of Plant Industry-National Seed Quality Control Services V (BPI-NSQCS 5) provided technical guidance and assistance in the conduct of the training.

The training aims to enhance the capability of rice seed growers to produce high-quality inbred rice seeds. Ultimately the training seeks to accredit the trainees as seed growers. It was spearheaded by Asst. Center Dir. Vivien Carable, together with the RCEF Technical Team, namely Mr. Jobenel De La Torre and Ms. Charlene Freeman. **Charlene O. Freeman**

# Melinda Yee at ang LESLIE PILI

**“ I ENJOY THE PILI BUSINESS.**

Taong 2018, sa edad na 62, nag-retiro si Melinda Yee bilang Agriculturist II ng Sorsogon City. Nag-silbi syang Agricultural Extension Worker ng City Agriculture Office sa loob ng tatlumpo't pitong (37) taon. Nagta-

pos ng BS Agriculture in Major in Agronomy sa Bicol University, nakita nya ang halaga ng mga pagsasanay.

“Several trainings ang na-attend ko. Nakita ko na malaki ang potential ng pili sa export market. Through trainings, several trainings tungkol sa

pili, palagi akong present, so parang nakukuha ko lahat na technologies. Aside from that, yung experience ko.” Kaalaman at mga pagsasanay ang nagsilbing panimula ng Leslie Pili Products noong 1990.

“Actually, nag-start ako as a hobby. Luto-luto lang, parang nagka-interes ako as processor ng pili. So yun ang naging start ko. Pero nasa office ako. Then nagkataon na ako ang naging Municipal or City-wide High-Value Crop Coordinator,” bigkas ni Melinda Yee.

“Sabado at Linggo, nagluluto ako ng mga confectionaries. Iba-iba, gaya ng glazed. Then nagkataon na naipadala yun sa States. Tapos nag-order na sila. Masarap daw. Talagang na-inspire ako dahil sa trainings. Na-realize ko na malaki pala ang potential for export.”

Sa gabay ng mga kaalaman tungkol sa pili (Canarium ovatum), naiparehistro nya ang Leslie Pili Products sa Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) bilang single proprietorship noong 1995. Leslie ang pangalan ng kanyang bunsong anak.

**MGA PRODUKTO**

Naging produkto ng Leslie ang iba't ibang uri ng prinosesong pili -honey glazed, dehydrated, activated, roasted, mazapan, salted, hot chili, pastillas. “Activated o dehydrated ang medyo malaki ang demand sa amin. Niluluto yan, pina-process thru dehydrator, moisture lang ang naalis pero ang nutrients nandyan pa rin. Compared to roasted o salted, kapag dinaan sa oven, nababawasan ang nutrients.”

Kinikilala bilang isang superfood, ang pili ay may taglay na kakaibang sustansya. Ito ay may omega fatty acids na mainam sa kalusugan ng puso, gayundin ang mga bitamina at mineral tulad ng magne-

sium, manganese, at Vitamin B1. Ang laki at hugis nito ay maihahalin-tulad sa almond, ngunit ang lasa nito ay malapit sa Brazil nut.

“Ang pili ay talagang may antioxidant properties. Ang nuts and oil ay may antioxidant properties. May vitamin E, vitamin A, phosphorus, potassium. Marami po ang mga nutrients na nakukuha natin sa pili,” pahayag ni Ginang Yee.

Bukod sa mga lutong pagkain mula sa pili, gumagawa na rin ang Leslie ng tatlong klaseng pili oil - ang pulp oil, kernel oil, at elemi oil. Ang Leslie ay pioneer sa pagproseso ng pili pulp at kernel oils.

“Ang pili pulp oil ay galing sa fresh pili drupe, yung prutas. Ang pili kernel oil ay galing sa nuts, we extract the oil. Ang elemi oil ay galing sa resin,” bigkas ni Ginang Yee.

“We consider the pili as tree of hope. Zero waste tayo sa pili, wala po tayong tapon. Even the exocarp, yung balat ng drupe - may gamit po yan. Yung shell meron po. Yung pulp ginagamit sa pag-process ng oil. Ang shell ginawang mga abubot.”

**MAHAHALAGANG LANGIS**

Gumagawa ang Leslie Pili Products ng pili pulp oil para sa personal care use - pantanggal ng makeup, pang-

kontrol sa paglagas ng buhok, ginagamit rin bilang massage oil. Gumagawa rin sila ng food grade pili pulp oil at pili kernel oil na maaaring gamitin sa paggawa ng salad, cakes, at cookies.

Samantala, ang elemi oil ay nanggagaling sa resin o katas ng puno ng pili. Upang maging sustainable ang produksyon ng elemi oil, itinuturo ng Leslie Pili Products ang tamang pagkuha ng resin o resin tapping. “Kasi kung basta-basta lang gagamitan ng itak, mamamatay ang puno. Nagpapa-training kami ng right process of resin tapping. Kaya meron tayong resin, still namumunga pa ang pili.”

Napakahalagang maalagaan ang mga puno ng pili. Ito ay kabilang sa Burseraceae, ang “incense tree family” kung saan nanggagaling ang frankincense (Boswellia) at myrrh (Commiphora). Ang raw resin ng pili ay may bangong taglay, kaya ginagamit rin itong air freshener.

Kapag naproseso at ginawang elemi oil, ito ay ginagamit sa paggawa ng pabango, sabon, hair conditioner, at shampoo. Ang mga malalaking kompanya sa cosmetics tulad ng Chanel ay gumagamit ng elemi oil. Ang elemi oil mula sa Pilipinas ay binibili ng iba't ibang bansa tulad ng France para sa kanilang perfume industry.

**MGA DOKUMENTO**

sa supply ng activated or dehydrated pili nuts na organically produced. Target nila organic certified.”

**MAKATARUNGANG PAGNEGOSYO**

Nagmamay-ari ang pamilya Yee ng 8.5 ektaryang pili farm na may 1,800 matatandang puno ng pili, at 4 na ektaryang extension farm na may 1,300 asexually propagated pili – grafted at inarched. “Three to five years namumunga na ang asexually propagated. Dyan kami kumukuha ng raw materials namin that is certified organic.”

Kumuhuha rin sila ng raw materials mula sa siguradong pagkukunan. “May mga farms kaming pinagkukunan na organic farming practitioners, members ng SPOFA (Sorsogon Provincial Organic Farmers Association).”

Pinipili nilang mabuti ang ginagamit na pili nut, at hindi gumamit ng nabubulok na pili. “Ang hindi pa matured na pili drupe ay nagbibigay ng bulok na lagting o pili with shell. I usually buy pili drupe, so we are sure na ang kernel ay may magandang quality.”

Ang pili resin ay nanggagaling naman sa iba’t ibang bahagi ng Sorsogon City at Albay. Ang pinagkukunan nila ay tinuruan din ng tamang pagkuha ng pili resin upang masigurong hindi masisira ang puno ng pili.

“Sa community, ‘pag nagka-conduct ng training as a Resource Speaker, binibigay ko lahat na technology, gaya ng elemi oil at pili pulp oil extraction. Kung kinukuha ako as Resource Speaker, ibinibigay ko lahat na technology, walang sekreto.

“Pag may order sa aming malaki, yung workers sa farms na nasa baba ng processing area namin, hina-hire ko. Nagpapa-training kami sa oil

extraction, karamihan mga babae. Dito kasi sa amin, may mga makina na, gumagamit kami ng mga makina. Pero nagha-hire pa rin ako ng gagawa ng manual extraction kasi kahit babae pwede mag-extract ng oil. Hina-hire ko pa rin sila.”

**KABUHAYAN AT KASIYAHAN**

Ang negosyo ay nagbigay sa kanyang pamilya ng ibayong tulong, paglalahad ni Ginang Yee. Ito halos ang nagpa-aral sa apat nyang mga anak. “Yung isa Electronics Computer Engineer, ang pangalawa Civil Engineer, ang pangatlo Electrical. Ang youngest, si Leslie – nakapangalan sa kanya ang kompanya – licensed Med-Tech at sa ngayon waiting for result sa medicine,” pagsasaad ni Ginang Yee na may halong galak at emosyon.

Subalit mabilis nyang dinagdag na kailangan ang pagti-tiyaga. “Two years, three years nasa pandemic na tayo, walang pumapasok na orders outside the Philippines. Kaya yun ang naging problema namin. Sa local meron din, pero konti kumpara sa orders mula sa labas ng Pilipinas.”

Naging instrumento ang Leslie Pili Products upang mas marami pang tao ang matulungan. “Dati, tinatapon lang ang balat. Naging pioneer ang Leslie sa pili pulp oil extraction. Sabi ko nga kung nagpapa-training, sa basura malaki ang pera pala, kaya wag na nyong itapon ang pulp. Extract the pulp oil, then may pera kayo, nakakatulong pa sa environment.”

Ano ang sekreto ng kanyang pagtagumpay sa makumpetensyang larangan na ito? Pinapahalagan nya ang mga kontribusyon ng pili sa bansa – ang pagbigay ng pagkain, kalusugan, kabuhayan, at kasiyahan. **Primalou B. Imperial.**

Bago naantala ng pandemyang dulot ng Covid-19, malakas ang pakikipagkalakaran ng Leslie sa mga kustomer nila sa ibang bansa. “Meron kaming markets sa Australia, New York, Boston Singapore, Sweden, Switzerland.”

Upang makapasa sa mga hinihinging sertipikasyon, iba’t ibang ahensya ang nilapitan ng Leslie. Bukod sa pahintulot mula sa DTI na magnegosyo bilang single proprietorship, obligado rin ang Leslie na kumuha ng License to Operate mula sa Food and Drugs Administration (FDA). “Maraming agencies tumutulong sa amin – ang DTI sa registration ng business name, sa Halal certification, at shared service facility (SSF) para sa grupo.

“Several analyses, maraming parameters o requirements sa pili ang dapat i-comply sa FDA,” ani Ginang Yee.

Tumutulong rin ang Department of Agriculture sa pag-subsidize ng pagpa-analyze sa FDA. “Sa pili may 10 parameters, more or less ang babayaran ay aabot sa P90,000. Ang DA ay nag-subsidize sa certification ng organic. Ang DOST ay tumutulong sa training, pagpa-analyze. TES-DA training pa rin, as well as ATI. Ang LGU tumutulong din.”

Bukod dito, dahil sila ay nagbebenta sa labas ng bansa, kumuha rin ang Leslie ng kaukulang permit mula sa DTI-Export Marketing Bureau. “Marami ding nagta-tap sa amin. Ang DTI Switzerland Attaché ay nag-tap sa amin para

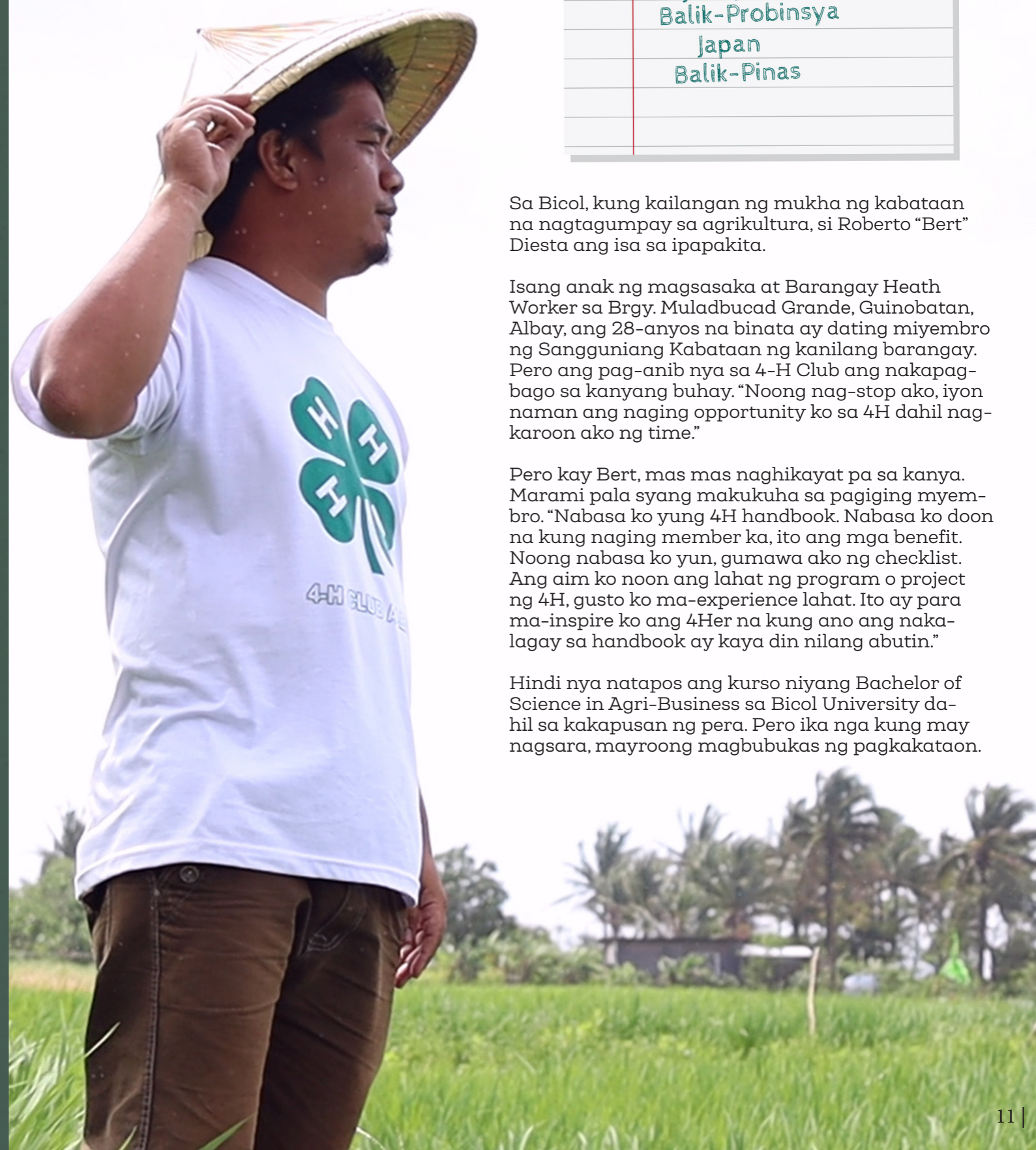

Isang anak ng magsasaka at Barangay Heath Worker sa Brgy. Muladbucad Grande, Guinobatan, Albay, ang 28-anyos na binata ay dating miyembro ng Sangguniang Kabataan ng kanilang barangay. Pero ang pag-anib nya sa 4-H Club ang nakapagbago sa kanyang buhay. “Noong nag-stop ako, iyon naman ang naging opportunity ko sa 4H dahil nagkaroon ako ng time.”

Pero kay Bert, mas mas naghikayat pa sa kanya. Marami pala syang makukuha sa pagiging myembro. “Nabasa ko yung 4H handbook. Nabasa ko doon na kung naging member ka, ito ang mga benefit. Noong nabasa ko yun, gumawa ako ng checklist. Ang aim ko noon ang lahat ng program o project ng 4H, gusto ko ma-experience lahat. Ito ay para ma-inspire ko ang 4Her na kung ano ang nakalagay sa handbook ay kaya din nilang abutin.”

Hindi nya natapos ang kurso niyang Bachelor of Science in Agri-Business sa Bicol University dahil sa kakapusan ng pera. Pero ika nga kung may nagsara, mayroong magbubukas ng pagkakataon.





### Jala-Jala

“Nalaman ko sa aming coordinator na may pa-exam para sa scholarship. At full scholarship ito, walang talagang gagastusin kaya nag-apply talaga ako noon. Ang dami naming nag-exam noon. Maraming kaming nag-exam hanggang sa paunti-unti. Sinwerte naman ako. Nakapasa sa qualification. Ang tawag sa scholarship ay Youth Empowerment for Sustainable Program o YES.”

Ang kurso nya ay Diploma in Entrepreneurship specialized in Farm Business Management. Pero kailangan nyang makalayo sa kanyang pamilya dahil ang paaralan ay nasa Jala-Jala, Rizal. Ito ang MFI Polytechnic Institute. Isang beses sa isang taon lang sila nakaka-uwi sa pamilya. “Kada December po kami umuwi. Ang maganda dito, sinusindo kaming mga scholar ng ATI para makapag-bakasyon.”

Lumawak ang kanyang karanasan. “Ang program nya talaga ay napakaganda para ma-develop ang skill. Doon kasi tr-semester sya for two years. Per semester, one month lang kami

sa school. Tapos three months kaming on-the-job training. So, halos walo ang farm ang napuntahan ko, na-experience ko. Doon ko nakita ang mga opportunity sa pag-engage sa farm. So iyun yong nagamit ko dito.

### Balik-Probinsya

Sa kanyang pagtatapos, ginawaran sya ng panimulang kapital para mag-umpisa ng kabuhayan at sa i-apply ang natutunan. “Ito ay amapalaya production... Yun amapalaya, noong 2017 hanggang 2018, maganda ang result kasi sakto naman, maganda ang presyo ng ampalaya noon. Ngayon, continuous po yun. Mayroon akong kinita. Ang kinita ko sa ampalaya, binili ko sya ng kalabaw.”

Maliban dito, nabigyan sya ng trabaho. Nakapasok siya sa Department of Agricultural Regional Field Office sa Camarines. Sur. “Two months kami as enumerator sa rice, Project MANA (Maunlad na Agrikultura sa Nayon).” Pero nag-uumpisa pa lang ang lahat.

### Japan

Isa si Robert sa piling mga kabataang nakasama sa Young Filipino Farmers Training sa Japan. Isa sya sa 21 batang magsasaka na natanggap sa programa. Napatunayang hindi lang sa Bikol ang kanyang charisma. Siya ang napiling lider. “At kahit mahina ako sa Nihonggo, ako parin ang pinili nilang lider sa grupo.” Yun mga kasamahan ko po kasi, is magagaling po kasi kahit yung lider nila ang hindi napakagaling sa Nihongo, lagi sila sa likod ko pata mah-interpret pag may problema po.

At sabi nya, masuwerte din sya sa pamilyang kumupkop sa kanya ng 11 buwan. “Yong farm, ‘yong host family ko. Very open sila. Sabi nga, blessed ako kasi doon ako napunta.”

Hinakayat syang matuto. “Sabi sa akin, ‘Ngayon gusto ko, pag-uwi mo sa Pilipinas, marami kang matututunan.’ Sabi nya, ‘magbigay ka sa akin na mga gusto mo pang matutunan dito

sa Japan.’ Ang sabi ko gusto ko ay iyong Smart Dairy Farming. So, ipinadala nya ako doon sa friend nya na may dairy farm. Tapos sabi ko gusto ko pa matutunan iyong Japanese Mushroom. Kaya sinend nya din ako doon sa friend. Kaya mga sa .list ko gusto kong matutunan, pinadala nya ako kung saan-saan. So halos nalibot ko din oo iyong Japan.”

### Balik-Pinas

Sa pagbalik nya Pilipinas, taglas ang mga natutunan kasama ang ipinamahaging puhunan, nagtayo sya ng pagkakakitaan. Grapes farming ang gusto nya at dahil wala syang nakitang mas magandang variety na angkop sa kanilang lugar, ang pag-aalaga ng baboy ang nag-ing alternatibo nya.

“Hindi dapat ako mag-swine production. Kaso ang project ko galing sa ATI ay fattening talaga sya. Kaso nagkaroon tayo ng problema sa ASF (African Swine Fever). Ngayon ang

positive naman na naibigay ng ASF is tumaas ang presyo ng baboy. Sakto bago ako mag-dispose nakuha ko ang mataas na presyo ng baboy. Bago ako mag-dispose, nahihirapan naman ako humanap ng mga biik na isi-second cycle ko. Ngayon ang sabi ko mag-iiwan akong isang baboy na magiging inahin. At ito na nga sya. May isang inahin ako. Nanganak na at may 12 piglets sya. Sa ngayon, ang walo, pinagbenta ko na. At meron ako ditong iniwan para sa fattening at magkakaroon ako ng dadgdag na inahin.”

Ika nga, sa tiyaga, may nilaga. Kay Bert, ito ay lupa.

“Ang bentahan dito may bumiling 4,000 at 4,500. Dati kasi ang bentahan 100-120 per kilo. Dahil sa nagkaroon ng problema sa baboy dahil sa sakit, umabot sa 170 to 200. So nakuha ko yong 200 kaya sinwerte. At iyong kinita ko, iyon ang binili ko ng lupa. Mga .5 hectare sya.” Plano nya pang palawakin ang kanyang bukirin. Idinagdag nya ang stingless bee production.

Ganon pa man, hindi nya isi-

nasarili ang kanyang natutunan sa Japan. Kasalukuyan syang consultant sa Albay Provincial Agriculture Office (APAO) kung saan kanyang ipinapalaganap ang mga kaalamat teknolohiya gaya ng Smart Dairy Farming. Plano nya maging Learning Site ang kanyang farm. Ito ngayon ang kanyang pinagsisikapan. “Ang plan ko ay maging LSA. Tapos maging farm school para maka-offer din ako ng TESDA course na NCII na related sa agriculture. At Farm Tourism (Site) din.

### Isa Na Lang

Sa kabila ng tagumpay, mayroon pa siyang pinapangarap. Ang natitira sa kanyang checklist. “Sabi ko nga may, two years pa ako. 30 years old kasi is ano na, graduate na. So sa two years na yon, may isa pa kasi sa checklist. At least kong hindi ako maka-compete sa National (Convention). At least, maka-attend ako, okay na ako.”

## Bantay ASF sa Barangay Training goes to Sorsogon City



**SORSOGON CITY, Sorsogon**  
The DA-ATI Bicol held the 7th and the 8th batch of Bantay ASF (African Swine Fever) sa Barangay: Training on Specimen Collection for Barangay Biosecurity Officers (BBOs) at the Paradise Resort, Hotel, and Restaurant, Crossing Pangpang, Sorsogon City last April 26-27 and 28-29, 2022. The consecutive two-day activities were in coordination with the Provincial Local Government Unit of Sorsogon (PLGU – Sorsogon) through its Provincial Veterinary Office (PVO) and Office of the Provincial Agriculturist (OPAg).

Before Sorsogon, similar training was held at Daet, Camarines Norte; Virac, Catanduanes, and Masbate City, Masbate.

Forty BBOs across the province completed the activities to capacitate them with knowledge and skills in ASF monitoring, sample collection,

handling, storage, and transport of laboratory specimens for ASF tests.

Subject matter specialists from the Regional Animal Disease Diagnostics Laboratory (RAD-DL) of the Department of Agriculture – Regional Field Office 5 (DA-RFO 5), Bureau of Animal Industry – Regional Veterinary Quarantine Station 5 (BAI – RVQS 5), and Provincial Veterinary Office of Sorsogon served as resource persons during the conduct of the activity.

Information dissemination was done through lectures and discussions. In addition, studies on ASF disease, the status of ASF in the province of Sorsogon, the Regulation and Control of Animal Diseases, Roles and Responsibilities of BBOs, filling-out of reporting forms, and environmental sample collection, handling, storage, and transport of laboratory specimens for ASF tests were discussed in the activity. Afterward, hands-on activities in environmental

and blood sample collection and filling out of reporting forms were done during the training to ensure the mastery and familiarization of the participants with the topics discussed during the lecture and discussion.

Consequently, an open forum was facilitated to address issues and concerns raised, such as the sentinel animals, BBO Kits, incentives, and situational cases like the sudden death of swine during specimen collection and coordination with backyard raisers. Moreover, sharing experiences between the participants and resource persons were adopted by other participants in their respective municipalities.

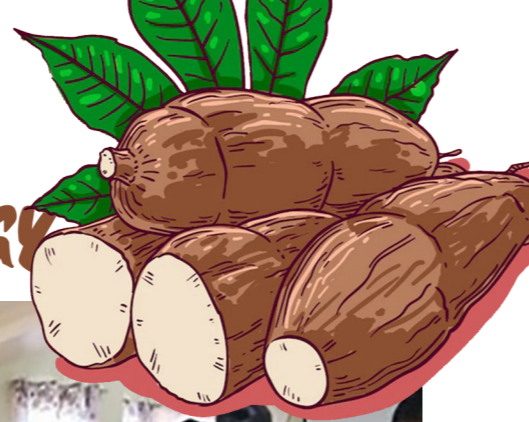
As indicated in the re-entry plan, weekly monitoring of swine in their respective communities will be implemented to prevent the spread of ASF. **John Kenneth Gelario**

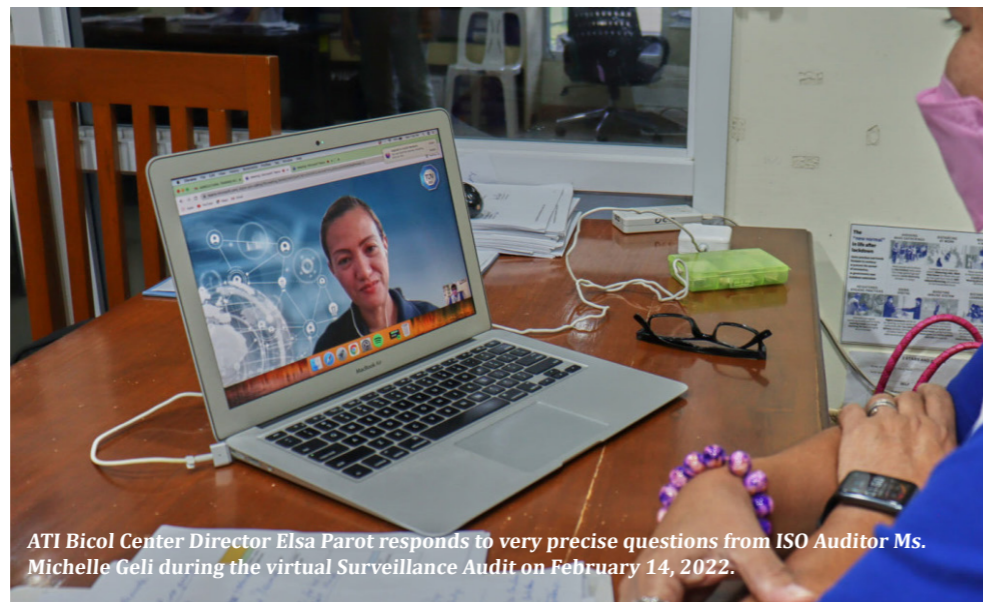
