WINS ORGANIC AGRICULTURE QUIZ BEE 2022

BOHOL – The Department of Agriculture (DA)-Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) in Central Visayas hosted its agriculture-based quiz bee contest for senior high school students (SHS) at Bohol Cultural Center on November 16, 2022.

The purpose of the program was to increase youth participation and increase knowledge on organic agriculture among young people.

Furthermore, to inspire young farmers and students to pursue organic agriculture, as well as showcase diverse technology through an agricultural quiz competition.

Additionally, to inform students on recent developments in organic agriculture technology and broaden their knowledge by presenting solutions to trivia questions.

Around 27 selected SHS students from various schools in Bohol joined the quiz bee.

The quiz bee's contents cover agricultural theories and legal considerations including the 2010 Organic Agriculture Act (OA Act), integrated diversified organic farming systems, organic agriculture, production of crops, livestock, and poultry, Philippine national standards on OA, and current affairs.

The quiz bee was divided into three rounds — easy, moderate, and difficult rounds. The following are the winners:

DISASTER RESPONSE TRAINING LEVELS UP



BOHOL – Agricultural Training Institute-Central Visayas (ATI-CV) implemented the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management: Skills Training in Handling Hazards for ATI Employees at ATI 7 Training Complex, Cabawan District, Tagbilaran City, this province on November 15-17, 2022.

The three-day training aimed to apply standard first aid in a workplace, demonstrate how to perform basic bandaging, apply different carrying rescue techniques, demonstrate how to perform firefighting techniques, demonstrate how to use rope in rescuing, perform Earthquake Simulation, and perform Fire Drill Exercise.

The three-day activity aimed to enhance the knowledge of participants on proper monitoring and evaluation of their programs, projects, and activities. In addition, define monitoring and evaluation and their purpose; describe the basics of evaluation and its process; describe problem structuring, and problem analysis; discuss the Theory of Change & Impact Pathways; discuss Project Monitoring Structure Framework; and discuss Results Chain, Project Evaluation, and Impacts of a Project.

HUNGER AND POVERTY REDUCTION THROUGH GOVERNMENT-AGENCIES

ENTRAL VISAYAS – The ATI in Central Visayas through the Enhanced Partnership Against Hunger and Poverty (EPAHP) Program is a collaborative effort among national government agencies such as Office of the President-Office of the Cabinet Secretary, Department of Social Welfare and Development, Department of Agriculture, Department of Agrarian Reform, Department of Health, Department of Interior and Local Government, and Department of Education, among others.

The program is in support to the government's efforts to address critical concerns on hunger mitigation, food nutrition insecurity and poverty reduction. The program is also in pursuit of the government's commitment to the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and in attaining "Ambisyon Natin 2040" which are consistent with the Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022's goals of inclusive growth and poverty reduction.

In support of this program, the Agricultural

Training Institute Regional Training Center 7 has committed to support 60 individuals for "Capacity Development for Farmers". These individuals were identified and are part of DSWDs' Sustainable Livelihood Program and/or beneficiaries of 4Ps. On top of providing technical knowledge on vegetable farming and financial literacy, capacitated participants were also provided with starter kits which include vegetable seeds, garden hose, seedling tray and some garden tools.

In collaboration with the DSWD Regional Office 7 and the local government units, two batches of training were already successfully conducted, reaching 62 individuals. The first training was conducted in Barangay Ermita, Cebu City, Cebu on September 21 – 23, 2022, reaching 30 individuals who are 4Ps beneficiaries. The training focused on urban gardening as this barangay was located in an urban community. The second training was conducted in La Union, Trinidad, Bohol on September 29-30, 2022, reaching 32 individuals. Trained participants are members of the Sustainable Livelihood Program Association in Trinidad.

The Department of Agriculture, along with its bureaus, like the Agricultural Training Institute, would strive to support the government's effort to address critical concerns on hunger mitigation, food and nutrition insecurity, and poverty reduction in urban and rural communities including marginalized communities.

ATI-7 LEADS REGIONAL STAKEHOLDERS CONSULTATION WORKSHOP ON ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PROGRAM FOR 2023-2024

Regional Stakeholders Consultation Workshop on Organic Agriculture Training and Extension Program FY 2023-2024 on October 14, 2022, via Google Meet.

The activity aimed to organize and identify relevant training and extension agenda for CY 2023 and 2024. In addition, updates on the Center's Accomplishments covering the period January to July 2022 were shared. The activity was also able to come up with training and extension plans and interventions for 2023 based on the needs of the stakeholders and the priority agenda of the Department of Agriculture.

arming is a vital part of our community, as it provides us with the food and produce we need to survive. It is also an important economic activity, providing jobs and income for farmers and farm workers.

In addition, farming also plays an important role in preserving the environment, by helping to maintain soil fertility and water quality. Additionally, many farms are also used for recreational activities such as hunting, fishing, and bird-watching. Good leadership can also help to ensure the association is running in an efficient and organized manner while maintaining a healthy and productive working environment.

Leadership also helps to ensure proper communication, collaboration, and trust between all members of the association, which is vital for a successful organization. Ultimately, excellent leadership is essential for any farmer's association to succeed in its mission.

The case is true, for LASOVEGA or La Suerte Organic Vegetable Growers Association based in Pilar, Bohol. Ms. Helen Labesores Dagulpo, Manager of the organization, envisions of expanding the group's resources and horizon since its establishment in 2010.

The dedication and enthusiasm of the officers have been major contributors to LASOVEGA's success.

Despite the pandemic's difficulties, the group persevered in trying to build a sustainable business. The DA accreditation of LASOVEGA improved its reputation as a reliable farmers' organization.

When they started out, they longed to avail the services of government agencies to help them develop their skills.

With the support of agencies such as the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) in Central Visayas, skills like Partnership development, product selection for promotion, market study chain, cluster commitment setting, agri-enterprise plan and mobilization, product supply arranging, and test marketing were among the expertise gained through the training initiatives attended by the organization's members.

Challenges Along the Way

Just like any other organization, LASOVEGA has its fair share of bumps on the road. For instance, they dream of having their own stable supply of water to irrigate their crops.



Moreover, they have to battle logistical issues like having decent transportation to travel their goods along the province.

However, this didn't hinder the organization from excelling and expanding its network.

In 2020, through the assistance of the Department of Agriculture -Regional Field Office VII (DA-RFO VII), minor equipment like crates, a multi-cultivator, water pump, and knapsack sprayer were given to the organization.

The group expressed its appreciation for the modest award







because it significantly aided them in making it easier to prepare

organic mixtures. The usage of the crates helped them handle their products by lowering postharvest losses.

Farmers have always had difficulties in the market, but the organization overcame even that during the pandemic. In 2020, they joined the DA's KADIWA program, where they frequently sold and transported their goods to adjacent barangays.

Even with the difficulties of the time, they were pushed to produce by the constant market at the height of the pandemic. The group, determined to realize its vision, rented a place where its members could get together frequently.

Ways Forward

From 2010 to 2018, LASOVEGA's production was seen as being on a small scale. The organization has however set its sights on going commercial scale by increasing its production area from five (5) hectares in 2010 to 17.5 hectares in 2021 after the Agriculture Forestry Fishery (AFF) enterprise clustering training.

In 2022, LASOVEGA became one of the Agricultural Training Institute's (ATI) Learning Sites for Agriculture (LSA) in the region.

The group wants to be able to communicate and impart useful agricultural technologies and farm management techniques to other individuals who are inclined to agriculture.

Furthermore, the organization wants to upgrade to an agricultural school by 2024, which will require more investments.

Daguplo claims that the idea is really ambitious. Nevertheless, it is essential because dreams are what motivates every firm.

If other farmers' associations start to view the issues as obstacles that must be conquered, then LASOVEGA's tale may also serve as a lesson for all organizations.

CEBU AEWS GRADUATES FROM CORN SSNM TRAINING

EBU CITY –Nutrient management is one of the important considerations in successful corn production. Improper nutrient management has various implications on the growth and yield performance of the corn plant.

Hence, the Agricultural Training Institute in Central Visayas (ATI-CV) conducted the Training of Trainers cum Refresher Course on Corn Production Technologies Specialized in the Site-Specific Nutrient Management (SSNM) held at One Central Hotel this city on October 11-13, 2022.

The three-day activity aimed to discuss the status of the Philippine Corn Industry; explain the principles of SSNM for Maize production; discuss the Fertilizer and Fertilizer Use with Varieties: OPV, Hybrid and Traditional; demonstrate the use of Nutrient Expert Module for Maize production; and formulate a doable re-entry plan.

17 COMPLETE FSTP PHASE II

AN JUAN, SIQUIJOR. The Agricultural Training Instite in Central Visayas (ATI-CV) implemented the Farmer-Scientists Training Program (FSTP) Phase II held at Brgy. Timbaon, this town on April 19 – October 13, 2022.

The season-long activity aimed to conduct handson experience and research in the corn-based production system as the basis for scientific farming. Moreover, they also perform experimental plots of corn in a farming system to compare different technological trials and determine the best farming practices in mixing yield and income potential in their farm; demonstrate integrated pest management (IPM) using biological control agents and natural enemies of pests and disease-causing organisms and proper use of pesticides; promote farming as a business enterprise through the formation of farmers' organizations, cooperatives and marketing networks; and develop self-reliant and sustaining farmers and communities through maximum production of corn and other economic crops to supply the market demand.

"Ang akong hikat onan sa eskwela sa FSTP ang pag pogas ug mais usa o duha ra ang itanom kay kini ang maayong abot o daghang ani sa mais. Ang akong pag husu ug banay pag cross breed sa mais. Ang akong kahibalo sa FSTP akong ishare sa uban ug silingan," shared Rose Nerry E. Quilicon, a participant from LGU-Liloan.

Furthermore, FSTP aimed to develop the technical and scientific capabilities of farmers in growing corn, vegetable fruits, root crops and other crops to enhance their knowledge of appropriate farming technologies and make them succeed in the business of farming and live in prosperity. Farmers were given some decision tools on what technologies to adopt based on the best results of their experiments.

A total of 17 farmer participants completed the FSTP Phase II.

The three-day activity aimed to discuss the management of breeding boars; discuss the different parts and functions of the male and female urogenital system; explain the basic hygiene and sanitation principles in the laboratory; perform laboratory exercises such as semen dilution, semen evaluation and care of Al equipment; discuss the Al Boar and the art and science of Al; and demonstrate semen Insertion.

ATI-7 RAMPING UP ASF PREPAREDNESS & PREVENTION

Regionwide. African Swine Fever (ASF) is a viral disease affecting pigs and wild boar with up to 100% case fatality rate. Since the Department of Agriculture (DA) confirmed the first outbreak started in July 2019, as of July 2022, 53 provinces, 704 cities/municipalities, and 3,832 barangays have experienced ASF outbreaks.

Thus, the Agricultural Training Institute in Central Visayas (ATI-CV) spearheaded the African Swine Fever (ASF) Preparedness Tabletop Exercise cum Consultation-Workshop at Bohol APC, Dao District, Tagbilaran City, Bohol on October 12-13, 2022.

The two-day activity aimed to asses the preparedness capacity of the Philippines against ASF specifically in Bohol Province; identify gaps that need to be resolved to strengthen preparedness against ASF, and enhance interaction and communication between participating offices, especially among the taskforce members per LGUs.

n response to the urgent need to scale cutting-edge technologies while aiming for Philippine agriculture modernization and competitiveness, the Agricultural Training Institute in Central Visayas (ATI-CV) conducted the School-on-the-Air on Smart Rice Agriculture (SOA-SRA) via radio broadcast over Radyo Bandera Sweet FM 106.9 every Monday to Friday at 5:30-6:00 PM which started on September 26, 2022, until October 21, 2022.

In the province of Negros Oriental, 3,000 farmers now have access to innovative agricultural technologies that could increase their output.

The SOA-SRA, branded as "Palay Aralan: Makabagong Pagsasaka sa Himpapawid," had the sole intent of aiding in the development of agricultural modernization by educating smallholder farmers and regional middlemen on cutting-edge and creative methods and smart technology for producing rice. Additionally, radio helps in amplifying information to reach areas that are restricted to agricultural extension personnel.

In partnerships with the Department of Agriculture (DA) -Central Visayas, Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), Negros Oriental State University (NORSU), Philippine Information Agency (PIA), Provincial Agriculture Office, City Agriculture Office, Local



Government Units (LGU) of the City of Bayawan and Santa Catalina, the program was able to produce 3,000 graduates.

To monitor the listenership of the enrollees, the program administered short quizzes, long exams, and final exams to determine the level of knowledge gained among the SOA-SRA students.
