"I dreamed that I could be a farmer. I began farming in 1990 and subsequently began teaching at Estaca Elementary School. The two areas of rice land that we till as family can harvest up to 12 sacks of rice. In addition to that, I also grow vegetable that helped me not to buy more dish in the market", adds Mrs. Bernante.

Producing their own rice and vegetables helped augment and secure their food for the family.

This also served as an avenue for them to create employment for their community since they need manpower to tend their land. "The number one challenge is managing our time. We have difficulty taking control of our time since we have so many children, seven children in fact, and at the same time I became the school head of the Estaca Elementary School and my husband is also a politician", express the school teacher.

Amidst their overlapping schedule, they still find time to fulfull their farming duties. And was recognized for their contribution to their community.

"Recently, I was awarded even in my busy schedule. We were awarded as the Best Implementer in DORP (Drop Out Reduction Program). Even in our busyness, we were able to overcome everything because of perseverance and our deep prayer to the Lord. We hope hat we can still serve everyone for a long time", aspires Mrs. Bernante.



Inspiration to Women

When women are empowered, poverty rates and food insecurity decline, they are able to pursue paid, steady employment, and her family's stability, nutrition, and overall health improve.

Accelerating these advantages will be closing the gender wage gap.

Knowing that, "my advice to women like me is to increase their love of farming.

My experience have acquired me capital and another source of income that helped me send my children in school.

I was able to extend help and even have a scholar enrolled in Dual Tech Manila.

Now they told me that their life is getting better because the school offered free tuition and free food. This allows them to save money", adds Mrs. Bernante.

Farm Management

"In managing the farm, we make our arrangements beforehand in the evening. My husband will manage in the morning because I am the school head of the school and during the night time I will be the one to manage our workers. That is the time we can spray on our farm. Sometimes we end our work at 12 in the evening.

On top of that, I also manage our seven children. There was also a time that I teach them how to do their assignments. I was able to manage everything.

Even in our busy schedule we always find time to pray to God. Our children's participation in the field when they were little, is that they help in collecting snails. Because spraying was not the norm before.

Also, they assist in picking, carrying, and caring during the planting season", recounts Isidrita.

Strengthening the cassava industry in the Philippines requires strengthening the linkage between production and markets accompanied by improved access to credit, supportive government policies and appropriate technical support, with this the DA-Agricultural Training Institute in Central Visayas (ATI-7) conducted the Kasama mo si Cassava: A Refresher Course on Cassava Production (Batch 1) held at the Agricultural Training Institute-Regional Training Center VII, Training Complex, Cabawan District, Tagbilaran City, Bohol on March 7-9, 2023.

The three-day activity aimed to upskill participants on the production and management of Cassava. In addition, (1) Related the status of Cassava Industry in the Philippines; (2) Discussed the Cassava Production Technologies; and (3) Identified the Pests and Diseases of Cassava plant.

ORGANIC FARMERS INVEST TO BECOME PGS CERTIFIED

CENTRAL VISAYAS - "I trust myself, that I can do it. That someday, I will become a certified organic farmer," said Lilia Ano-os. This is the insight of Ano-os after attending the 10-day Training of Trainers (TOT) on Participatory Guarantee System (PGS).

The said TOT was held at the Plaza Maria Luisa, Dumaguete City on February 13-22, 2023. It was attended by 16 farmers and 4 agricultural extension workers coming from Bohol, Negros Oriental and Siquijor. These farmers and AEWs came from the different municipalities/cities of Amlan, Bais City, Canlaon City, City of Tanjay, Dauin, Manjuyod, Sibulan and Vallehermoso in Negros Oriental province; Larena, Lazi, San Juan and Siquijor in Siquijor province; and Bilar in Bohol province.

The training aims to capacitate PGS Groups on the establishment and operations consistent with the organic agriculture standards and corresponding technical regulations.

Another participant in the name of Raul Tubac, mentioned that this training has enlightened them that their farm practices have a long way to go to become a certified organic. Yet, the experience also offered them knowledge on how to equip themselves on different organic practices leading towards an organic certification. Now, these participants have created their plan of action and are aspiring to build a core PGS group in order to create a pool of peer reviewers who would help small farmers to spend less when undergoing an organic certification application.

One of the outputs from this TOT is the development of their procedures for their manual of operations and their re-entry plan. And now, these farmers are aiming to form a PGS core group in their respective provinces.



LIVESTOCK PROGRAM activities



P10M SWINE MULTIPLIER FARM BREAKS GROUND IN AMLAN, NEGROS ORIENTAL

AMLAN, NEGROS ORIENTAL -- The Agricultural Training Institute-Central Visayas (ATI-7), local hog farmers, and the local government unit of this town, broke ground on December 15, 2022, for the P10 million swine multiplier and technology demonstration farm project in order to improve the swine industry in the province and entire Central Visayas.

The farm will be able to accommodate 60 sows. It was funded by the Department of Agriculture - National Livestock Program through ATI-7 in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture-Regional Field Office 7.

The creation of this multiplier farm aims to maintain a source of qualified, high-quality hogs that will be available to and accessible to nearby farmers.

Present during the activity is the Local Chief Executive of LGU-Amlan, Mayor Jose Manuel Sycip together with their Municipal Agricultural Officer, Mr. Jovencio Felicilda; OIC-Veterinarian, Ms. Belinda Villahermosa and Mr. Alejandro E. Rapal, PATCO in Negros Oriental with #ATICentralVisayas OIC Center Director, Dr. Gracia Fermentira Arado and Livestock Focal Person, Mr. Vherney Cabasag II.

This is a part of the government's effort to speed livelihood restoration and recovery, particularly for those hog businesses affected by the epidemic and African Swine Fever (ASF).

The swine multiplier farm is aligned with DA's Bantay ASF sa Barangay Program which was created in response to the ASF. The farm addresses one of the program's key components: the repopulation of hogs in areas not affected by ASF.

TRASH TO CASH: ANIMAL WASTE MANAGEMENT AND UTILIZATION

REGIONWIDE. As part of the center's efforts to maximize the use of animal waste, the Agricultural Training Center in Central Visayas (ATI-7) conducted the Trash to Cash: Training on Animal Waste Management and Utilization held at the Agricultural Training Institute-Regional Training Center VII, Training Complex, Cabawan District, Tagbilaran City, Bohol on February 20-24, 2023.

The five-day activity aimed to upskill participants on the basic concept of climate change and to ensure that effluents from piggeries and farm animal establishments are properly managed and utilized as a source of renewable energy. In addition, (1) Explained how the livestock farming influence climate change; (2) Identified and listed down livestock farming practices contribute to climate change; (3) Demonstrated how to make home-made mini Biodigester; and (4) Established or re-echo waste management practices.

Omarbliss B. Dalam, Senior Agriculturist from ATI-11 (Davao Region), discussed the Biodigester (Its Principles and Construction), CSA livestock, -Hands-on Demonstration.

While, Mr. Vherney C. Cabasag III, Agriculturist II from ATI-7, talked about Climate Change, Vermi Composting, A-Z in Hog production.

A total of 20 Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs) from across the region, attended the activity.



BASIC TRAINING COURSE ON ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION (AI) AND PREGNANCY DIAGNOSIS (PD) FOR LARGE RUMINANT

REGIONWIDE. Artificial insemination (AI) and pregnancy diagnosis are important techniques in the reproductive management of large ruminants. Al involves the introduction of semen into the reproductive tract of the female using various techniques, while PD is the process of determining if a female is pregnant. These techniques can greatly improve the efficiency of breeding programs and contribute to the overall health and productivity of the herd.

The large ruminant industry in the Philippines is comprised of cattle and carabao (water buffalo) farming, which are important sources of milk, meat, and draft power for farmers. The industry faces challenges such as low productivity, inadequate infrastructure, and limited access to finance and technology. However, efforts are being made to improve the industry through various programs and initiatives aimed at increasing productivity and competitiveness.

In this regard, the Department of Agriculture (DA)-Agricultural Training Institute in Central Visayas (ATI-7) implemented the training Basic Training Course on Artificial Insemination (AI) and Pregnancy Diagnosis (PD) for Large Ruminant held at the Ubay Stock Farm, Lomangog Ubay, Bohol on March 06-25, 2023 with 13 participants across the region.

The month-long activity aimed to capacitate and provide technical knowledge and practical skills in Artificial Insemination and Pregnancy diagnosis. In addition, (1) Know the basic anatomy and physiology of the male and female reproductive systems of large ruminants; (2) Discussed animal nutrition; (3) Discussed and explain good animal husbandry practices; (4) Identified/detected heat period of a large ruminant;

(5) Proper evaluated, maintained and monitored the semen quality used for artificial insemination; (6) Know the recent advances in animal breeding and livestock improvement; (7) Performed artificial insemination using the recto-vaginal method; (8) Imparted knowledge on the usefulness of artificial insemination and large ruminant husbandry practices among farmer clientele.

"So, isa ra gud among ma promise as ATI nga all the knowledge, learnings and skills that we gained from the 3 weeks long skills training will be put wholeheartedly to the field with the shared common goals with Unified National Artificial Insemination Program (UNAIP) in carrying out efficient and effective livestock breeding programs using artificial insemination technology," shared Franz F. Sumondong, Agricultural Extension Worker (AEW) from Maria, Siquijor.

DIGITAL AGRICULTURE COURSE GAINS 40 GRADUATES

REGIONWIDE. Digital Agriculture refers to using digital devices to gather, process and analyze spatial (object) or temporal (time) data. This data can direct focused activities to increase agricultural efficiency, productivity, and sustainability. Digital technologies bring data from our fields and facilities to our fingertips. It can create a sustainable agricultural future by harnessing data's power and training others to do the same.

The Agricultural Training Center in Central Visayas (ATI-7) organized the two batches of Training of Trainers on Digital Agriculture Course (DAC) held at the Agricultural Training Institute-Regional Training Center VII, Government Complex, Tagbilaran City, Bohol on February 7-9, 2023 (Batch 1) and February 21-23, 2023 (Batch 2).

The three-day activity aimed to train farm schools in implementing the Digital Agriculture Course for RCEF. FROM BEAN TO BAR: TRAINING OF TRAINERS ON CACAO AND COFFEE POST-HARVEST HANDLING AND PROCESSING

REGIONWIDE. Chocolate is a delicious treat that brings joy to many. Its rich and indulgent flavor is hard to resist. Whether you enjoy it as a snack or use it in your baking, chocolate is a wonderful way to lift your mood and satisfy your sweet tooth.

The Philippines has a small but growing chocolate industry, with some companies producing high-quality, single-origin chocolate using locally-sourced cacao beans. However, the industry still faces challenges such as limited supply of cacao beans, lack of infrastructure, and competition from imported chocolates. Efforts are being made to address these issues and promote the growth of the Philippine chocolate industry.

In this regard, the DA-Agricultural Training Institute in Central Visayas (ATI-7) conducted the training entitled "From Bean to Bar: Training of Trainers on Cacao and Coffee Post-Harvest Handling and Processing" held at the Agricultural Training Institute-Regional Training Center VII, Training Complex, Cabawan District, Tagbilaran City, Bohol on March 13-17, 2023.

The three-day activity aimed to capacitate/enhance the knowledge, attitude and skills of our Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs)/ High Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP) Technicians on cacao and coffee postharvest handling and processing. In addition, (1) Discussed the Situationer of Philippine Cacao and Coffee Industry; (2) Elaborated the postharvest operations and processing of cacao and coffee beans; and (3) Crafted a doable re-entry plan.

"As a first timer on cacao and coffee training, I don't have any background or idea of it. But during the training I am very impressed, especially when we had site visitation/actual demo. Mas nindot gyod nga naay actual vs. lecture in order to experience and understand the main point. So that we will become a good trainer after we go to our respective municipalities. The five-day activity aimed to equip and/or enhance the knowledge, attitude and skills of our Agricultural Extension Workers (AEWs), teachers, students and their parents on vegetable production and edible landscaping emphasizing on good agricultural practices while recognizing gender roles and responsibilities.

Moreover, the participants also are expected to (1) Discussed the Basic Concepts of Gender and Development; (2) Explained the factors to consider and the challenges in edible landscaping;

(3) Demonstrated edible landscaping technologies and processes; (4) Executed the cultural practices and management of urban containerized gardening and edible landscaping; and (5) Crafted a doable re-entry plan after the activity.

CAPACITATING NURSERY OPERATORS TO INCREASE ACCREDITED NURSERIES IN THE REGION TO ENSURE AVAILABILITY OF QUALITY PLANTING MATERIALS

UBAY, BOHOL - "There is money in seeds and seedling production", said Rufina Artiaga after she attended the 5-day Training of Trainers on Plant Nursery Establishment, Management and Accreditation. ATI Central Visayas conducted this training as there is a need for farmers and agricultural extension workers (AEWs) to understand the techniques and importance of plant propagation, and appropriate production protocol. The training aims to capacitate the LGU-owned and private nursery operators in plant nursery establishment, management and accreditation.

"Aside from producing good quality seeds and planting material, it (nursery establishment) generates income. Scion, bud stick and seedlings can be sold", said Janice Estoras.

"After this training, I am aiming to establish our own nursery, will secure parent trees, collect different seeds of fruit trees and apply the skills and knowledge of the training," said Jose Labonite.

The said TOT was held in Pacheco's Inn, Poblacion, Ubay, Bohol on February 20 – 24, 2023. It was participated by 23 participants from

municipalities/cities of Calape, Garcia Hernandez, Loay, Pilar, Sagbayan, San Miguel, Ubay, and Valencia in Bohol province; Alcantara, Asturias, Dumanjug, Mandaue City, and Toledo City in Cebu province; and Ayungon, Basay, City of Bayawan, La Libertad, Santa Catalina and Sibulan in Negros Oriental province.

The participants are farmers who have existing nurseries aspiring to establish their nurseries, agricultural extension workers and teachers from senior high schools offering agriculture courses which also have school nurseries. Certificate of training is also one of the requirements for nursery accreditation and renewal.

Going forth, the Department of Agriculture, through the support of the Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI) through the National Seed Quality Control Services (NSQCS), aspires to accredit more nurseries for the production and distribution of quality planting materials from accredited plant nurseries.

Meanwhile for Negros Oriental, they are: LIVESTOCK Breeding Center based in Bayawan City.




In addition, for the province of Siquijor, it is FARMILIA Ancis based at Lazi.

WHAT IS AN LSA






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
